GREEN WHEELY BINS - Collection days for March: 14th and 28th



In the month of January there were 24 incidents (16 in Kingsclere, 1 in Ashford Hill and 7 in Headley) which have been classified as crimes by the home office.

Dwelling Burglary: Two reported. Attempts were made to access the front doors at properties on South Road and Coppice Road, entry was not gained.

**Non-Dwelling Burglary:** Two reported. Two garages were broken into at building site on Winchester Road. A large amount of diesel and an excavator were stolen. Unknown person(s) have gained entry into the Headley Village Hall and stolen some copper piping causing damage in the process.

**Traffic Incidents**: Four reported. Three have been damage-only road traffic collisions on Newbury Road, B3051 and A339 by Folly Farm, and the other a more serious road traffic collision on the A339 junction with Kingsclere.

**Theft of Vehicle:** none reported this month.

**Theft from Vehicle:** One reported. A vehicle parked on South Road was broken into and several items stolen. The offenders were disturbed by a witness who was then threatened before running away.

**Theft:** Six reported . One at the Shell garage on Newbury Road, one at McColls, Swan Street, one at Folly Farm (off the A339) and one at Nelsons Diner. The final two were making off without payment (for fuel) at the Shell garage.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB); four reported. Assault: four reported.

Public Order: two reported.

**Criminal Damage:** One reported. Spray paint has been sprayed over a front door at property on South Road.

**Suspicious Incidents:** Six reported. Of note, a transit van with two males and dogs were seen in a field off Meadham Lane, Hannington likely to be involved in hare coursing.

#### **Nature Notes**

Most people have seen murmurations of starlings on television where thousands of birds perform elaborate manoeuvres whilst avoiding one another. We saw a 'mini' one recently involving Fieldfares near Hollowshot Lane. This large flock, we estimated 500+, were feeding next to a flock of Jackdaws and every so often the entire flock would rise into the air as one, complete a wavy circuit of the valley and fall to the ground. As they twisted and turned in perfect unison the low winter sun caught their grey backs and pale undersides. They landed briefly before rising again to complete further performances.



Driving to Tadley on a quiet lane recently we saw a roe cross the road, we slowed as we knew there are often more to come, there were. Numbers two, three, four, we stopped the car. More deer emerged from right to left in a steady, disciplined stream the later ones more lightly built, probably younger beasts. The final ones had to wait nervously for those ahead to squeeze through the gap but eventually they all made it. We hadn't counted them but upwards of twenty we believe. We pulled up to look at the gap in the hedge through which they had passed. The animals must use it regularly as it would have fitted the cross-section of a deer perfectly and not an inch to spare. What had made the sight of the deer more magical was that the early morning light was behind them which showed them in silhouette.

News from the feeder: A pied wagtail feeding, not seen before. Two pairs of bullfinches are regulars, hope that one pair will nest in garden hedge again. Sparrows are increasingly visiting fat balls to feed.

### The Church Pages

By the time you read this, we will be in the season of Lent. ' This period commemorates Jesus' forty day fast in the wilderness. That's why people sometimes 'give up' something for ' Lent, which is around forty days. Two things that are on my mind as I think about Lent:

Firstly, Lent is a time when we remember that unlike God, we are not holy, complete, perfect people. The Bible talks about sin as the ways in which we have ignored God and lived life without Him doing things the way we want rather than what He wants. This can include specific deeds and words but can also be our attitude and thoughts. On Good Friday, 30th March this year, we remember Jesus dying on the cross for the sins of the whole world. It was really costly for God to see his only Son dying in such a horrific way. I've been personally challenged recently about how lightly I think about the sin in my own life, whether it's cross words because I've had a bad day, or envy, jealousy... the list could go on. Much of the time I don't even notice it and when I do, I may say sorry, but I don't put much effort into changing. God the Father loves us the way we are but loves us too much to leave us that way. This Lent I hope to try and co-operate with him a bit more!

Secondly, if you've given something up, how are you going to keep doing it for forty days? What's interesting about Jesus' fast is that though He appeared to be in the desert fighting hunger on His own, He wasn't. Just before He went into the wilderness, he was baptised and then this happened: "the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove" (Luke 3:22). Jesus had the help of the Holy Spirit to give up food for forty days. That begs the question: when we gave up chocolate, or alcohol, or doughnuts, or television, did we ask for the God's help? The Holy Spirit is eager to fill us up and help us during Lent. In fact, even if you haven't given anything up for Lent, God wants to help with all the challenges in life, so why not get down on your knees (actually or metaphorically) and ask Him?


