

KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Borough Council recently published their consultation on the Pre-Submission Local Plan 2011 – 2029 and we trust many Kingsclere residents took the trouble to visit the exhibition explaining in more detail what the Plan involves. Over 13,000 new homes are to be built in the Borough over the next 16 years, 50 of these will be in Kingsclere. Where these new homes will be built will be decided by the community through the Neighbourhood Planning process, which is why we need your involvement over the next few months. We will shortly be issuing a questionnaire to every household within the Parish Boundary. Please take the trouble to complete and return this important document, which will also be available on line.

NEW SHOPABOUT BUS SERVICE TO TADLEY

The new service will be launched by The Mayor on Wednesday 9th October at 10.00 in Monk Sherborne.


The service will run on Wednesday and Friday each week, will start in Ashford Hill Road at 10.16, travel through George Street, call at Rose Hodson Court for passengers and then take everyone to Sainsbury's at Tadley to arrive at 10.50. We are also investigating the possibility of the Bus calling in at Fielden Court to pick up passengers directly from there. There will be a 2 hour turn around and shoppers can re-board the bus at Sainsbury's at 12.40 for the return journey home. This service will be free to all those with a Concessionary Bus Pass and the fare for all other people wishing to use this service will be £5.00 return. We are hoping that many people will find this new service invaluable so that it may continue to run for a very long time. Please see posters for more details.



Nature Notes



Two ducks which swam into our view puzzled us. They were a rather drab brown colour with little to distinguish them other than their bright yellow beaks. Later, we saw they had orange legs and that should have rung bells but didn't. We consulted our bird books and were rather shamefaced to discover that they were in fact mallard drakes in eclipse (moult). At this stage the beautiful green of the head and chestnut colour of breast had gone leaving the male actually duller than the duck.

Greylag geese are usually gregarious and are found in their own company or that of Canada geese, the one we saw was in neither. It sat alone, precariously balanced on a branch thrusting out of the Kennet's current which was surprising as its feet were designed for paddling and not for gripping but seemed to be coping well.

Walking beside the Kennet recently we noticed a small area of bankside vegetation partly worn away due to what looked like a burrow. A closer inspection revealed a wasp's nest built into the bank with some occupants sunning themselves on it. Even though our approach was very quiet and unobtrusive the calm wasps went into pre-attack mode and we withdrew. Was it vibration from our approach or some super sixth sense that triggered this response?

A shallow, shady new Forest stream gave us good views of a grass snake swimming strongly and hunting for aquatic life. Totally submerged at times the head emerged at intervals while the sinuous body created ripples.

Church Pages

A Famous Villager!

Almost alongside our Catholic chapel of Saints Peter and Paul in Swan Street, on the wall of a house is a Millennium Plaque noting that the site once belonged to Archbishop William Warham. Another is to be found not far from Saint Mary's Church. However, I doubt that many residents are aware of this piece of history.

William Warham was Archbishop of Canterbury during Henry VIII's reign. Born around 1456, he became Bishop of London in 1501, and shortly afterwards was appointed to Canterbury, in which post he died in 1532.

Noted as a man of learning, he enjoyed Henry's complete confidence for many years, often being employed on State business. With Thomas More, he supported the work of the great Dutch scholar Erasmus in promoting the new learning of the Renaissance in England. Although theologically conservative and opposed to Protestantism, he showed little urgency in reforming the abuses in English Catholicism.

At first he opposed the king's attempt to divorce Queen Katherine of Aragon to marry Anne Boleyn. Having a great devotion to the Canterbury martyr Archbishop Thomas Becket, some expected him to follow the road of martyrdom over the matter. However, in May 1532 he submitted to Henry's demands. Historians still wonder why, because his opposition would have made things very difficult for the king. His health was bad, and he died in August 1532.

So, as you walk around Kingsclere, remember one of the important churchmen of the English Reformation, who had a residence here!


