

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL – The Parish Council's Annual Meeting will follow the Annual Assembly on 4th May 2018.



DEFIBRILLATOR – It has been highlighted that not everyone is aware that there is a defibrillator located at the Fire Station in Kingsclere. The unit is located outside the front door and is available 24hrs a day. The defibrillator is within a locked cabinet and the code to open will be given by the emergency operator (999).

PILLAR BOX – Following the closure of the Post Office in George Street, the Parish Council tried to retain the Pillar Box which was located outside. Unfortunately, it was removed last Autumn but we have tried to get a Pillar Box reinstated in the Village Square. Despite highlighting that there is insufficient capacity with the current smaller post boxes we have not had any success. When assessing the need, Royal Mail's position is that there was a post box within ½ mile and therefore no need. The fact that the boxes are overflowing at Christmas was not considered. If residents feel there is a need for Pillar Box please would you log your concerns with Royal Mail. Nature Notes

The sycamore tree that housed a local rookery, often mentioned in our notes, has been removed so that the birds have had to find a new home. Fortunately, there was another tree nearby in the shape of a scots pine and nests have been constructed and the tenants moved in. There is an established rookery nearby so they have just moved a little closer to their neighbours. Their activities and nests however are less obvious now as they have swapped bare branches for evergreen foliage.



It was good to be walking in sunshine after the gloom and wet of Easter as we splodged our way around Frith Common. Hedges were just showing a haze of green and everywhere a feeling that this was it - Spring. Moving clouds of black in a puddle caught our eye which we discovered were hundreds of tiny tadpoles recently hatched: Not much of a future for these however, little food and the puddle may dry out as the sun warms. Crossing the golf course it was good to see that a pair of Egyptian geese was still co-existing with the members and have two pretty goslings.

When a blue tit flew into the patio doors recently (happily it bounced and flew away) it seemed a good idea to follow RSPB's advice on window stickers. To this end two homemade, black paper swallow silhouettes in flight were displayed on the glass. Immediately visits by blue tits to investigate the nestbox nearby ceased. This was unusual as it has been used regularly and successfully, were the 'swallows' mistaken for hobbies, small migrant falcons with swift-like silhouettes? The paper birds were removed and prospective tenants are back again.

Police Report March 2018



In March there were 32 incidents (25 in Kingsclere, 2 in Headley and 5 in Ashford Hill) which have been classified as crimes by the home office.

Dwelling Burglary -

A large amount of money was stolen from a property in Kingsclere.

Non-Dwelling Burglary – Three. A shed was broken into at a property on Newbury Road and items were stolen. A garage was broken into at a property on Little Knowl Hill and items taken and lastly an attempt was made to gain entry in a shed at a property on Winchester Road, nothing was taken.

Traffic Incidents - Four. Three were damage only road traffic collisions in Kingsclere and the other was a vehicle seizure for no insurance.

Theft from Vehicle - Three reported this month. A number of tools were stolen from a temporary electricity generator stored within a lorry at South Road. Two vans were broken into on Longcroft Road and a number of items stolen and lastly an attempt was made to gain entry (smashing a window) into a vehicle parked in White Hill car park, no items were taken.

Theft - Three reported this month. Heating oil has been stolen from within the tanks from two properties in Little Knowl Hill and the other was a making off without payment at Kingsclere Filling Station.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) - There have been three reported this month.

Criminal Damage - One reported - damage was caused to a fence in King John Road after some children crashed into it whilst sledging in the snow.

Suspicious Incidents - Eight. Of note, a person wearing a head torch was seen for 10 minutes looking into windows at a property in Penny's Hatch. A white van (X133***) was seen in Byfields acting suspiciously, one male was seen snooping around a skip on a drive whilst the other stayed in the vehicle. A silver Fiesta (V383***) was seen in Hannington driving erratically. The vehicle had several males and a dog in it so possibly linked to hare coursing.

Assault – Eight. **Public Order** - Three.

Planning is going forward to support the Commonwealth War Graves commission and their scheme to erect a sign near the churchyard to mark the fact that we have a number of Commonwealth War Graves within the village; this is a nationwide scheme to raise the profile of WW1 soldiers who were killed during the war and their final resting place.

Reflections



It's so easy to be cynical about the world around us, isn't it? There are so many challenging things happening, whether it be Syria, Russia's relationship with the West, immigration, Brexit, terrorism, tragedy, anti-social behaviour, and much more. It would be very easy given all the bad news we read and hear about to believe that things will never change, that the world will always be a place of pain, confusion, terror, etc. Surely if you are a realist then you can see that nothing has changed and that nothing will change.

But that leaves us in a very depressing place if we choose to think about it. It's not bad for most of us in Great Britain, we can just get on with our lives and ignore it. But for those facing injustice as the norm, water and food shortages, persecution, and corruption, it cannot be ignored and there must be some hope that things will not always be this way.

For Christians, that hope is something embedded deeply in the faith. This hope is not something uncertain (like I hope I get a Ferrari for my birthday!) but a hope that is centred on an event that has already happened. When Jesus rose from the dead, He did so to give hope to all who put their trust in Him, a sure and certain hope of eternal life. He embodied (literally!) what rising from the dead would look like, how it would be different but similar. He still ate and drank after He rose from the dead but people didn't always quite recognise Him. The disciples touched Him but He could appear from nowhere.

And not only that, but God promised that one day, Jesus would return and that He would make everything new. All the things that are wrong with the world will finally be dealt with. We'll no longer need to put the world to rights, but they'll be plenty to enjoy and talk about. It will be heaven on earth.

This hope is something that can pull us out of the doldrums of cynicism and apathy, and can give us a vision of how the world can be and will one day be. But until then, we need to ask God how we might begin that work of transformation right now through hope filled actions. Let's allow ourselves to be inspired this month.

Improvement Projects

The project to replace the doors and windows, to improve the drainage on the fields and to resurface the hard play area is progressing with the help of grants from Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council and Hampshire County Council. This is a big undertaking for KCA committee and representatives of our sports teams and we would like to thank all the people who are giving their time voluntarily to see through this work on behalf of our community.
