Get Help with the Cost of Living

If you don't have enough money to live on, you might be able to get help to afford essentials like bills and food. This

includes the Household Support Fund and cost of living payments. You should check if you can claim benefits - you might be able to do this even if you work, have savings or own a home.

If you owe money and you're struggling to pay:

- You should speak to the organisations you owe money to they might let you pay smaller amounts or take a break from payments.
- Don't ignore bills or letters about money you owe.
- You can find out how to start dealing with your debts.

Check what benefits you can get

You might be able to claim benefits or increase your current benefits if you're:-

- Of working age and on a low income.
- Sick or disabled.
- Of State Pension age and on a low income.
- A carer.
- Responsible for children.

Kingsclere Neighbourhood Plan

By the time you read this the NP Group will have met once again. The main item on our agenda will be the draft site selection report prepared by the

consultancy AECOM. The report analyses the potential of various sites for development which are adjacent to the village should the need arise to find future sites. The final report will be published on the Parish Council website.

In November, members of the NP group and the Parish Council have been invited to a meeting with Borough Cllrs. regarding the Local Plan review. Following the meeting we should have a better idea of potential changes to the Local Plan and their implications for Kingsclere.

By now residents should be aware that a revised planning application has been submitted for Porch Farm. The overall number of new houses has been reduced to 165. Details can be found on Basingstoke & Deane's Planning Portal, reference 22/01856/FUL.

This is my final report on the NP for the Tower. After ten years as chair of the group, I am stepping down, although I will remain a group member. If you are interested in the future development of the parish, we would welcome new members to our Neighbourhood Planning group. All of us are residents of Kingsclere with an interest in the future of our village and surrounding area. If interested, please contact me on this mail address.

We have recently moved to one single (local rate) telephone number for Watership Down Health – **0333 034 1033**. Please ensure this is a *Safe Number* on your list, so that when we call you, the number is recognised

On the day appointments

From September, we will be asking for your cooperation with a trial that we are undertaking to prioritise those who have to be seen on the day, whilst advising others on a suitable way forward. To do this we will send you a text via an AccuRx text link, after you have phoned. This link will ask you to complete a simple online assessment. For those who are unable to use digital services, our receptionists will be asking a few more questions to help us prioritise.

Cancelling appointments (from a Smart phone)

If you need to cancel or if you no longer need an appointment, please respond when you receive a text reminder. This immediately releases the appointment to be available for another patient.

Flu vaccines

The influenza immunisation programme will start in early October. We will vaccinate those in the priority groups below:

- Those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups.
- Pregnant women.
- Those aged 65 years and over.
- Carers and close contacts of immune-compromised individuals.
- Frontline workers in social care settings employed by social care providers without employer led occupational health schemes.

Those patients who are outside these groups can pay to have the influenza vaccination through a community pharmacy.

Our bees have had a hard summer. They had a good start. They were making lots of comb honey and the queen was laying eggs. At the beginning of August we noticed a few hornets and wasps flying around and within two weeks, the hornets (and



wasps) were inside the hive, taking all of the honey and pulling the heads off of the bees! My Dad has it (mostly) under control now, but he doesn't think the bees will have enough honey to survive through the winter.

We went to Guernsey over the summer holidays and I saw so many amazing things. On the first night while I was on the beach with my family, we saw a barn owl hunting over the sand. There must have been mice running around because I'm not sure owls eat crabs!

We went on a boat trip to Herm Island a few times and on one of the trips, we



saw about 15 seals floating in the sea and laying on the rocks. There are meant to be puffins that live on the island, but they leave in the middle of July and don't come back until April. There must have been a storm out to sea one night because as the tide went out in the morning, there were hundreds of jellyfish and crabs washed up on the beach. I felt sad for them, but it was amazing to see all the different colours and patterns they had on them.

The Church Pages

Hello!

I was in the garden at the vicarage this morning, noticing the light carpet of leaves on the ground, a sure sign that the season is changing as we leave summer behind and head into Autumn.

I was reminded of a photograph I took of the "yard" at our home in

California a few years ago, ankle-deep in red and golden leaves in the middle of "Fall". It's a beautiful time of the year, and Beverley and I are looking forward to seeing the wonderful colours in the countryside here for the first time. I'm also a little concerned by just how deep my carpet of leaves will grow in the weeks ahead. I feel the purchase of a large rake, or a leaf blower, approaching!

Of course, the leaves are falling as part of the complex annual cycle of the life of a deciduous tree, and if they didn't fall the tree might not be able to survive the freezing temperatures of winter.

I'm thankful for distinct seasons here in England, but, as I write this, we've just had record-setting September temperatures.

The weather is one of our nations' favourite topics of conversation, and the world has certainly experienced some extremes in recent years. This summer, much of Southern Europe and parts of North America had extreme heat and wildfires as a consequence, and torrential rains have brought floods to many nations across the globe.

You won't be alone if you're concerned by these weather extremes. For many they are the cause of great anxiety. If this is you, I'd like to encourage you to turn to Jesus.

He said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." If you are weary of the news you see and hear, if you are burdened by the cost of living, physical or emotional pain, or anything at all, then come to Jesus. He <u>WILL</u> give you rest.

You can come to Jesus right where you are, at any time of the day or night. He is always available. Or you can come to one of our church services, the dates and times of which are elsewhere in this magazine and join us as we lay aside our worries for a time, to focus on His magnificence.

Coming back to trees and weather, the prophet Jeremiah writes far more eloquently than I, summarising the rest we find in Jesus:

"But blessed is the person who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

October in the Garden

October is the best month for autumn colour. The trees should be good this year as we have had a kinder summer.



Hopefully, we will still get some warm days this month enabling us to get the garden tidied up before the winter sets in. With frosts possible, dig up any tender plants that you would like to save for next year. Dalias can be dug up, cut back and left to drain upside down, then stored in a dry frost-free situation until required next year. Other tender plants that need to be dug up are geraniums (Pelargoniums), gladioli and Cana lilies.

There are lots of jobs to be done this month. Cut back and divide herbaceous perennials if they have become overgrown. If the centre of the plants has become bare and unsightly it is time to divide them. Later flowering perennials are best left to the spring to divide.

Summer bedding plants need to be pulled up and disposed of. Seeds can be gathered now to be kept for next year. I had a conversation with two of our horticultural show judges recently and discovered a reason that sometimes seeds do not germinate is often due to the way they are stored. I found this interesting as I had several failures this year with some of my seeds. I understand that some serious exhibitors store seeds at a very low temperature. Some keep them in a suitable container in the fridge or the freezer until required. The advice seems to be if you buy seeds, get them as soon as possible when they arrive at the sales venue and store them yourself somewhere cool until required.

Now is the time to plant daffodil bulbs. Tulips can be planted later, into next month if necessary, remembering that tulips like drainage, some grit in the pot helps to stop them from rotting. I usually add grit to most pots when I am planting them up. I find that this works well for me.

Keep deadheading roses. These will sometimes flower at Christmas if the weather is mild enough. This is a good time to plant new rose plants. If you can get bare rooted plants, it is more cost effective.

In the vegetable garden runner and French beans will need cutting down. Leave the roots in the garden, if possible, to put back valuable nutrients into the soil. Dig over any space in the vegetable garden which is not needed until the spring.
