GREAT BRITISH SPRING CLEAN COMES TO KINGSCLERE

We have signed up to the Keep Britain Tidy "Great British Spring Clean" and will be hosting a Kingsclere Spring Clean event on **Saturday 30th March 2019, 10am-1pm**. The Parish Council will have a gazebo "station" in the Churchyard where volunteers can come and collect equipment to help collect litter. So join us as we prepare to stand together and declare that single-use plastic litter – which degrades the beauty of our environment and threatens to harm wildlife – is not acceptable.

The power of Blue Planet II – over 70% of people now view tackling litter as more important than they used to and 75% feel more appreciative of people who pick up litter, according to a new survey carried for Keep Britain Tidy by Ipsos MORI. More than 67% also said they tried to purchase less single-use plastic than they used to, and eight out of ten people said they thought people who litter-pick are vital to protecting the environment.

Please do come and join the team on Saturday 30th March 2019 and demonstrate your support to help collect and safely dispose of single-use plastic from our streets, open spaces and footpaths. If you are interested in becoming more involved with the organising for the day, please contact either John Sawyer or Louise Porton (contact details above). Youth (or other) organisation teams are welcome to get involved.

DOG FOULING

Once again dog fouling in public places is becoming a problem. Complaints have been received about the local footpaths, in particular the area where footpath 91 (The Dell) and footpath 89 (Hollowshot Lane) meet. Can we appeal again to everyone walking dogs to ensure that they clear up after their pets. Dog waste can be disposed of in all the public litter bins all around the village. Please do not leave plastic bags containing dog faeces in the hedges or verges.


In Remembrance Wynn

Nature Notes

We were alerted to a lake locally where a large saw-billed duck, a goosander had been seen. No luck for us on our visit but it was still worthwhile. In nearby conifer woodland which included Norway Spruce, there was such a vibrant, evergreen carpet of bilberry growing under the well spaced trees where sufficient light allowed such abundance; Bilberries usually like woodland edges or open heathland. One towering spruce tree had a wonderful crown of dangling cones which caught the winter sun, turning them to burnished gold. The ground beneath was strewn with cones, stripped to the core by squirrels.



If snow should fall may it always be like the last one. It came on the Friday, steady and gently through the day. It stayed where it fell, no wind to create drifts and pots in the garden gradually grew tall chef's hats of snow. School was closed and it seemed the whole village was outdoors enjoying winter activities even building a full sized igloo in one case. A crisp weekend and then, on Monday, like a well mannered guest it took its leave. Apologies to those who had to struggle but our usual snow is such miserable slushy stuff and this had real beauty.

The bird table has a wide selection of foods but suet pellets seem to be the preferred choice over mixed seed by visiting robins, sparrows and even a blackcap.



Reflections

Last month I talked about making time to spend with God, reflecting on those words from a song in the Bible: Be still and know that I am God (Psalm 46). I wonder how you got on?



Did you manage to find a bit of space to mull it over? If not, did you want to but business took over and you never got round to it. I find it so easy for that to happen – why not give yourself 5 minutes now? Find a quiet place, read over the words and let them sink in.

One important thing we as a church did last month was hold a vision day for our regulars. Having spent time thinking and praying, we set aside a day to discuss our vision as a church and to come with some ideas about what we thought we should be involved in. It was great to see so many willing to set that time aside, to do the important thing together, and not allow other things to encroach. One thing that struck on the day was about how we welcome people. A lady made the point that she didn't think that people who weren't Christians realised that they are welcome at church too. I was struck by this and as a church we'll be thinking about how we make clear that all are welcome. In fact the Bible tells us that we are to welcome one another as Jesus welcomes us (Romans 15:7).

We hope to make some progress on this in the coming weeks and months. Let me re-iterate how welcome people are, whether they believe in Jesus or not, to come and join us on Sunday mornings. Our traditional services are at 8 and 11 on Sunday mornings most weeks in Headley, Ashford Hill, and Kingsclere. Each Sunday in Kingsclere, we have breakfast together at 8.45am in the church room – come and join us for a croissant and some coffee. Then at 9.15ish we move into the main part of the church building for the service. I'd be delighted if people came to see what it was like, even if they didn't want really to join in. We'd love to see you – consider it an invitation – and we'll try and give you a warm welcome as we learn what it means to welcome like Jesus welcomes us.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting and Full Revision of Electoral Roll for St Mary's Kingsclere

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting is to be held on the 1st April 2019 at 6.30pm in the Kingsmill Room. This is the occasion when we celebrate what has been happening in our church community over the past year, and conduct business such as elections to the posts of churchwardens and the Church Council.

By enrolling on the electoral roll, you become a voting member of the Church of England and are able to attend and vote at the meeting. It also gives an indication of the real membership and strength of the church in our parish.

Every six years the roll is completely revised meaning all names are removed from the current register and everyone has to re-apply. The deadline for this in 2019 will be **15th March 2019**.

If you would like to be added to the roll, please visit the Benefice website: www.clerewoodlands.org.uk and click on Electoral Roll.

If however you do not have access to the internet, paper forms can also be found at the back of St Mary's Church. Please complete and return to the Church Electoral Roll Officer or Churchwarden before the deadline.

The requirements for joining the roll are:

*Being baptized and over the age of 16, willing to declare yourself a member of the Church of England AND

*Either resident in the parish or have habitually attended worship in the parish for six months prior to enrolment.

Changes to St Mary's Church Interior

The project team have now met twice and a number of drawings and possible schemes were prepared for consultation.

We have been careful to look back into the archives to see what had been considered previously and what the church authorities and other heritage organisations had deemed possible or in some instances NOT acceptable! Its quite a task to make sure we can fit in the right amount of seating in such a narrow nave with large areas taken up with things such as the Kingsmill Tomb.

We want to make the entrance more open and welcoming and where possible introduce modern materials (glass and light wood fittings) Within our team we have different ideas and, as with most things in life, there will need to be compromises

Some of the initial ideas will be presented to the PCC for their comments and further meetings with our architect are planned for March.

We remain on track for a presentation on 1st April after the APCM where plans will be shown for people to give comments and suggestions. They will NOT be final plans for acceptance or rejection but a working document which I hope will inspire constructive and helpful ideas which we aim to incorporate into our final scheme.

The meeting to discuss the schemes will be in the Kingsmill Room at St Mary's at 8.00 pm on 1st April. There will be refreshments at 7.45 pm.

I hope to see as many of you there as possible. As a community we should all have an opportunity to be a part of the future changes of one of the Village's prized assets, our church.


