HEDGES – We often get requests in the office to write to property owners about overgrown hedges, verges and overhanging branches that obstruct the footways, paths and highways around the village. Now is a very good time of year to cut hedges and we respectfully ask all property owners with hedges bordering the footways and highways to cut them back within their boundary.

BONFIRES – There are no laws against having a bonfire, but there are laws for the nuisance they can cause. You could be fined if you light a fire and you allow the smoke to drift across the road and become a danger to traffic. You cannot get rid of household waste if it will cause pollution or harm people's health. This includes burning it. If you must have a bonfire, please respect your neighbours. If you need to complain about a bonfire – Your council (Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council) can issue an 'abatement notice' if a neighbour's bonfire is causing a nuisance. A bonfire must happen frequently to be considered a nuisance. Your neighbour can be fined up to £5000 if they don't stick to the notice. Leaflets on bonfires are available from the Parish Office during opening hours if you would like a copy.





Nature Notes

Walking along the K&A canal recently we saw more swallows than we had seen during the entire summer. They had congregated on a rather spindly bankside tree with little foliage and were using the exposed branches as perches. From time to time they would fly out en masse, perform a few circuits above our heads and then return to their roost, having exercised their wings presumably in readiness for migration. Before the electricity and telephone services strung their wires across our countryside and provided convenient resting places, swallows and martins would always have sought a handy tree on which to assemble.



Two bullfinches played cat-and-mouse with us within a high-hedged footpath. Their white rumps had identified them, but we were determined to get a better view. For their part they were happy to flit just ahead of us, keeping just out of sight. Finally, they stayed long enough for a sighting and proved to be youngsters, very dull and very brown.

In August we disturbed a roe doe in the woods at Bowdown. She moved quickly to a safe distance and we walked on. Then we heard the sharp bark that is typical of roe of either sex, and which can be due to territorial aggression or fright. Not to be confused with a dog, the sound carries for a good distance and once heard is not forgotten.

Hedgehog courtship is incredibly lengthy. One evening a fairly small female hedgehog, foraging in the garden, was joined by a rather unusual silvery-gray companion. The ritual that followed was like a strange dance. The larger male made endless attempts to get behind the female while she, as determinedly, made sure he didn't, occasionally ramming her suitor broadside with her snout and snorting all the while. Should the courtship result in a new family of hoglets they would sadly be born too late to survive the winter.

The Church Pages



"Scared-ey – it's a bit dark-ey" says my daughter, Cara, one morning, as I'm in the midst of brushing her sister Chloe's teeth. I had asked Cara to go to her room to get some clothes. But with the change in the seasons her bedroom is now too dark (probably also to do with the blackout blinds!). So I leave Chloe with clean teeth to go and switch Cara's light on so they can get ready for nursery.

I wonder whether you are as 'scared-ey' of the dark as my daughter is. We're well into autumn now and it's getting darker as winter approaches. Darkness is strange, isn't it? Because it can be both frightening and can shield us from fear. The thing with darkness is things can hide in it, but we can also hide in it ourselves. Perhaps we'd prefer the spotlight didn't come on us during the evening concert. But at 3 a.m. when you think you've heard a noise downstairs, darkness is far from comforting.

As a church we try and focus on light during the darkest months. Light and darkness are really key metaphors in our faith. Jesus Himself says, "I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life". This light is much more comforting than being hidden in the darkness, for when we step into this light we see ourselves as we truly are. This can initially be frightening and yet it means that we live, not in a dream-world where our imperfections are hidden by the darkness, but in the real world where we see our imperfections, but know that God loves us the way we are, and yet loves us too much to leave us as we are!

As we explore and focus on the Light of the world in the coming dark months, we will of course, as ever, celebrate Christmas and enjoy our candlelit services and the twinkling of little lights on the Christmas tree. But we don't want to wait until December; so at the end of this month, Sunday, 30th October at 10:30 a.m., we are going to have a Messy Church Light service in St. Mary's Church, Kingsclere. This will be similar to our Messy Church services we hold at Kingsclere school with craft, celebration and a meal. It would be great to see you there.



Kingsclere Fire Station Update

This month's update includes a selection of incidents attended by Kingsclere Fire Station, seasonal prevention measures, training achievements and where you can find us on social media. It has been a busy month for Kingsclere Fire Station and in particular two incidents are worth highlighting.

In August our crews attended a large fire in a flat at Woolton Hill, which involved numerous fire appliances from both Berkshire and Hampshire. Whilst the fire was prevented from spreading into the adjacent flat, considerable damage was sustained to the whole property. The incident highlighted the benefits of professional and accredited installation of electrical appliances

In early September we were the first fire appliance to arrive at a large fire involving two containers at the De La Rue paper-mill in Overton. The black smoke was visible as soon as we crossed White Hill. Kingsclere were aided by all Basingstoke's fire appliances and crews. This incident highlighted the benefits of having a tried and tested fire plan that can be provided to the Fire and Rescue Services on arrival.

On both occasions we provided four firefighters with breathing apparatus, and used all of our 1,800 litres water supply.

With an autumn chill back in the air we would like to remind those with open fires or wood burners to and maintain them and their chimneys. Chimney fires are unfortunately common ,but the risk can be reduced.

In August the station crew qualified for Immediate Emergency Care (IEC). This will increase our effectiveness in trauma incidents across Hampshire and Berkshire.



Chineham Board Gamers


