ANNUAL PARISH MEETING followed by AGM – The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on 16th May 2016. As part of the meeting there will be a presentation. Please come along and support this event. We are busy gathering in reports from all the Groups and Organisations in the village for the Annual Report which was very well received again last year. If your Group wish to be included, and have not already done so, please get your report to me as soon as possible at clerk@kingsclere-pc.org.uk Thank you.

FAREWELL CATHY -. By the time you read this our Borough councillor Cathy Osselton will have attended her last Parish Council Meeting in Kingsclere. Cathy has served as our Borough councillor for the last 13 years and has decided not to stand at the election this May. The parish council said farewell to Cathy at their Ordinary Meeting on 25th April. Thank you Cathy for all of your hard work over the years and we wish you well in any future ventures.

LANDSCAPE WATCH - Hampshire County Council holds a large quantity of aerial photography and satellite imagery. In order to monitor and manage environmental change i.e. flood vulnerability, loss of habitat and preserve areas of national character, these maps need to be

interpreted. Aerial photography makes detailed analysis all but impossible – interpretation using the human eye is the only solution. Because of this and the large size of the task, HCC has established a new community project, Landscape Watch Hampshire. LWH needs the help of community

project, Landscape Watch Hampshire. LWH needs the help of community groups and individuals to help interpret these maps. The LWH database contains pairs of aerial images of Hampshire taken in 2005 and 2013. Maps are divided into cells of 200m x 200m. Participation in the project is free and once logged on to the database, users annotate the land use of both maps thus building up an overall picture of how the area has changed.

If you would like to participate in the project, log on to www.landscapewatch.com. Once registered the on-line tutorials will guide you through the process.

KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Congratulations to Oakley & Deane who are the first of 12 Neighbourhood Planning groups in Basingstoke & Deane whose Plan has passed their

parish referendum. The turnout was nearly 44% with almost 95% voting in favour of the plan. There is also good news with the Borough's Local Plan which has been approved by the Secretary of State and will now go to the Full Council on 26 May for adoption. At this point, it will form the development plan for the Borough, and will guide development for the period up to 2029, providing the framework for Neighbourhood Plans.

As for our own plan, we have seen the first draft of the Strategic Environment Assessment which looks very positive. Linden Homes have provided an ecology briefing paper and an initial review of access and transport issues for the Porch Farm site. Both will appear on the web. Our next task is to agree our criteria for evaluation the remaining sites and applying the criteria so that we can draft our final policy on where to develop homes in Kingsclere. We will also be engaging a consultant who will draft our plan which, when approved by the Borough, will be the subject of a formal public consultation. Finally, my apologies for the late posting of some documentation on our web site. We've had a few glitches of late but will endeavour to post information more promptly in future.





past ten years and outbreaks of disease have been evident during this time but it has still come as an unpleasant surprise to see a completely spawn free pond. The fish will be disappointed too as the previous annual glut of tadpoles provided a springtime feast. Nature always shows amazing powers of recovery and the weather during Autumn and Winter has been unusually wet and warm so here's to a recovery in the months to come.

From a distance tufted drakes look black and white but we were able to admire one at close quarters. He was in full breeding plumage, had a head and neck shot with purple, a vivid golden eye, a bill of slate blue and a wonderful dark tassel hanging on his nape, a really handsome bird.

Our common cock pheasants are magnificent birds but familiarity makes them taken for granted. While walking on a large farming estate we were stopped in our tracks by a most wonderful bird. Clearly a large pheasant of sorts, each pale gold feather trimmed with black giving a chain mail effect. The tail was a huge arching plume while the white head and black bar across the eye was reminiscent of a burglar's mask. This beautiful creature, strutting its stuff, was a Reeves Pheasant now reared and released as a game bird. A second one was spotted later.
