

KINGSCLERE LIBRARY

Good news about our village Library. IT WILL NOT BE CLOSING. Through the combined efforts of your Parish Council and the Village Club Trustees, over twenty volunteers supported with funding from the Parish Council and The Headley Trust will take over the Library on March 31st and start operating on April 7th.

Four volunteers have formed a Volunteer Coordinating Team and training for volunteers has already begun supported by Hampshire County Council Library Services. Initially, opening hours will remain unchanged but will be kept under review. KINGSCLERE PARISH PATHS WORKING GROUP

On Sunday Jan. 25th we had our first meeting for 2015. Thank you to the seven volunteers who turned up. Some of us worked on Footpath 53 that is behind the bungalows on Ash Grove, leading from the end of North Street towards the by-pass. This path had become very muddy due to fallen leaves and also soil washed down from the banks bordering the path. In places this was quite deep, but we were able to clear most of it to reveal a good surface underneath. We have asked Hampshire County Council Rights of Way team to try and clear the path completely. The rest of us took an inventory of all the tools etc. that we use and then we all had a very useful "business/coffee" meeting to discuss future plans! Please, if anyone notices paths that need attention, contact myself or the Parish Clerk.

Resources available to the County Council are now more limited, and our voluntary work on the rights of way is even more important. In Kingsclere we are a small part of the 2,800 miles of the public rights of way network (footpaths, bridleways and byways) in Hampshire. It is vital that we work to keep these open and encourage people to use them; it has been proven that exercise contributes to good physical and mental health.

KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

At our February meeting we met with representatives from Barton Willmore and landowners of the two sites between Strokins Road, Coppice Road and the A339. We discussed their proposals for 16 and 26 dwellings respectively. In addition we have received confirmation that land at Porch Farm may become available for development. We have engaged our consultants, AECOM (formally URS) to undertake further work on the viability of these three sites.

We will shortly be posting a paper on our website listing all the sites we have considered and the reasons for their exclusion/inclusion in our work to date. Along with the results of consultations over the past 18 months, we hope this will explain why many of the sites previously suggested by residents are unsuitable for development.



The Basingstoke Canal – Heroes and Villains

Roger Cansdale has been a leading light of the Basingstoke Canal Society for some fifty years and has been involved in its restoration from the beginning. In his recent talk to the Kingsclere Heritage Association he described the history of the waterway from its inception in the 1770s to its present slightly truncated form. Built to develop trading links between the market town of Basingstoke and London the canal enjoyed mixed success. Opening in 1810 its only really profitable period was fifteen years later when it carried all the materials to build the London and Southampton Railway to Basingstoke, which promptly removed most of the waterway's profitable traffic.

The canal ran through the Aldershot area to the Wey Navigation which linked it with the Thames. In Surrey it climbs through 29 locks from the River Wey to the summit at Frimley. From there it winds round the countryside till it reaches the Greywell tunnel, leading finally to its basin at the foot of Wote Street where Festival Place now stands. Interesting to note that it always suffered from an insufficient water supply, frequently closing in summer.

The 'villains' transpired to be a string of financiers who purchased the canal in the 1800s as a pawn in various fraudulent deals. With their involvement the canal slowly dwindled despite the efforts of the Harmsworth family who were boat builders and barge operators associated with the canal for two hundred years. After the lock gates at Aldershot were blown up by soldiers in the 1940s the canal rapidly deteriorated and was subsequently not included in the nationalisation which formed British Waterways.

The canal's revival came about during the 1960s when a small team set up a society to effect a 'rescue', and began recruiting volunteers and raising large sums of money. Over the next twenty years thousands of people contributed their labour and money and in 1994 the canal was officially reopened as far as the Greywell tunnel. The section onwards to Basingstoke has had to be abandoned because the construction of the M3 and the Ring Road made it impassable. Although now well used, the canal still needs lots of enthusiastic support.

Roger is a confident speaker and he brought the restoration project to life with his intimate knowledge of its history.

Nature Notes

Clearance of scrub, mainly hawthorn and blackthorn has been taking place on local Downs recently so that the area can be grazed by sheep which will ensure that re-growth does not take place. In addition to controlling the spread of these invasive species it will also benefit butterflies and a survey last Summer found Duke of Burgundy fritillaries present in some places. The fire, after several hours of being fed a large number of bushes, grew fierce and it was no surprise to hear and see steam pouring from an adjacent trunk, the sap was actually boiling.

We often walk alongside the Kennet and Avon canal and in late January we had the opportunity to study a lock in depth literally! Restoration work on the Aldermaston Wharf lock required the entire lock to be drained and two gates were removed for repair. Standing on the lockbed is quite an experience and reveals the whole design and working parts from a very different angle. Nearby we discovered a small pond with a group or 'spring' of teal, easily recognised by their gentle whistles and small size. Spring refers to their ability to take off almost vertically from the water. Teal like shallow water and mud to feed in but this little group were performing what we took to be courting rituals.

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

Reflections

In Sadness and Thanksgiving

The Catholic Chapel of Saints Peter and Paul in Swan Street closed on Saturday 31st January, and will now be sold by our Diocesan authorities. Reluctantly, Bishop Philip Egan of Portsmouth accepted the advice that a dwindling attendance and the considerable expense required to establish proper disability access made the closure inevitable.

Kingsclere remains part of Saint Michael's Catholic Parish, centred in Tadley, and the Bishop wishes the good Ecumenical links to continue. Our local Anglican and Methodist friends have been very supportive during this difficult time, and the last non-Eucharistic Service in the chapel was the Kingsclere Unity Service at 4pm on Sunday 25th January. Thus, over 40 years of Catholic presence in the chapel ended in fellowship with our local Christians.

However, in spite of the sadness, there was also a real sense of gratitude to God for these many years – for the many graces received in the building and for the witness given by former parishioners now deceased.

On Saturday 24th January, on behalf of the Bishop, Father Christopher Rutledge, the Dean of the Pastoral Areas of North-West and North-East Hampshire, celebrated a moving Mass of Thanksgiving. This was followed by a fine reception which lasted well into the afternoon!

On Sunday 25th January, the chapel was almost full for the last Mass, with a large number of people from Saint Michael's Church joining the Kingsclere community in a full Sung Mass. All was done well!

Annual Parochial Church Meeting and Revision of Electoral Roll for St Mary's Kingsclere

Forms can also be found at the back of St Mary's Church. Please complete and return to the Church Electoral Roll Officer, a churchwarden or the Vicar before the deadline.

The requirements for joining the roll are:

- Being baptized and over the age of 16, willing to declare yourself a member of the Church of England AND
- Either resident in the parish
- Or have habitually attended worship in the parish for six months prior to enrolment.

Being on your parish church's electoral roll is a way of demonstrating your willingness to be counted as a member of the church community and committed to its survival and flourishing.

St Mary's – What we do ...Part 2

Last month I wrote about the church's ministry of prayer in the parish. This month my focus is Pastoral Care. In the course of daily life in the parishes, we all become aware of villagers who are lonely, depressed, bereaved, sick or housebound – or struggling to cope for one reason or another. The church has always sought to minister in such situations by offering one or more home visits with a sympathetic listening ear – and prayer if requested.

These days with the size of the parishes I'm responsible for, it's impossible for this to be done by the Vicar only – and the skills for this ministry are certainly not limited to the ordained. St Mary's has a team of nine Lay Pastoral Visitors who have undergone training and been authorised by the congregation to carry out this ministry on their behalf. This means we are able to respond to requests that come from various sources (Social services; caring agencies, the local grapevine) as well as visit people in hospital.

We are also able to visit those who were once church members who become housebound or even move into residential care if not too far away – Home Communion is also offered and currently 4 people in Kingsclere receive Communion roughly once a month in their homes. Additionally, in a few cases, we are able to offer follow up visits to those who have been bereaved and whose funerals have taken place at St Mary's.

We are hoping to train more visitors later this year so that we can spread more widely. If you know of anyone who would appreciate a visitor from the church on a one off or occasional basis, please do contact me in the first instance.

As well as the £11,000 already paid or pledged for the stone works recently completed at St Mary's, FOSM have now also agreed to contribute a further sum of nearly £7,000 for additional, urgent, stone & roof repairs, the need for which emerged only during the recent work.

As noted in last month's Tower, the next major phase of works at the Church will entail the complete overhaul of the electrical and lighting systems, the cost estimate for which is very substantial. We have agreed to be responsible for up to 50%, dependent on the availability of other grants and contributions. This will considerably reduce our funds, and we will be working hard to build these up again to help with fabric repairs in future years.

We have yet to finalise this year's fund-raising programme, but the next event is the Plant Sale, in St Mary's Churchyard on Saturday 16th May, from 10 a.m., offering the usual range of flowering perennials, some annuals, salad and other vegetables, and herbs. 
