

KEEP FAT AND WET WIPES OUT OF PIPES

Thames Water have been spending a lot of time in the village clearing drains. Our drains are elderly and delicate and cannot cope with excess fat and baby wipes. Sewers are only designed to carry water, toilet roll and human waste. Anything else can collect in pipes causing nasty blockages that prevent sewage from flowing and can cause it to back up into homes, streets and rivers.

What can I do to help?

- Leave cooking fat to cool and then scrape it into the bin with other food waste;
- Don't flush wet wipes – even if they say they're flushable they still block pipes as they can take years to disintegrate;
- Put sanitary products, nappes and cotton buds in the bin;
- Take chemicals, solvents and engine oil to your local refuse site for safe disposal.

DOG FOULING

Once again we regret having to remind people to pick up after their dogs. The problem of dog fouling in Kingsclere is growing again and we would like to remind people that it is an OFFENCE not to clear up after your dog. To prevent any prosecutions and to help us keep the village clean and safe please clean up after your dogs. Dog waste can be disposed of in all the public litter bins all around the village. Thank you.

ALERTS FROM TRADING STANDARDS

Wrong Council Tax Bracket - Fraudsters have been phoning victims telling them that they are calling to let them know that they have been placed in the wrong council tax bracket for a number of years and that they are entitled to a rebate, they normally say that this rebate should be worth £7000. Since mid July Action Fraud has received 16 reports.

Once the victim is convinced, the fraudster tells them that in order to receive the rebate they will need to pay an administration fee in advance; the payment they ask for varies between £60-350. The victim provides the details and makes the payment, but then is no longer able to make contact with the person they spoke to on the phone.

When they phone their council about the rebate and the fact that they are in the wrong tax bracket, the council will confirm that they know nothing about it and that they have been contacted by fraudsters.

The fraudsters have mainly been targeting both male and female victims who are aged 60 and over and live in the Sussex area, but it is likely that the fraudsters will also start to target victims in other areas.

How to protect yourself:

- Never respond to unsolicited phone calls
- Your local council won't ever phone out-of-the-blue to discuss a council tax rebate, if you receive a call of this nature, put the phone down straight away.
- No legitimate organisation will ask you to pay an advanced fee in order receive money; so

never give them your card details.

- If you think you have been a victim of fraud, hang up the phone and wait five minutes to clear the line as fraudsters sometimes keep the line open. Then call your bank or card issuer to report the fraud. Where it is possible use a different phone line to make the phone call.

To report a fraud and receive a police crime reference number, call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or use the online fraud reporting tool.

Suspicious Telephone call being received by Hampshire residents - The caller, who may suggest links with Hampshire County Council or mention the Governments Green Deal initiative, states that cavity wall or loft insulation previously installed by the consumer may be faulty and requires remedial work. They then try to arrange an appointment to visit the consumer.

- Any person receiving an unsolicited telephone call of this type is advised not to agree to a visit.
- If a visit has already been arranged, we would advise that the appointment is cancelled.

Please report these calls to Trading Standards though our partners in the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 03454 04 05 06 (If possible, with the name and/or telephone number of the caller).

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work instigated as a result of a cold call. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. Details can be obtained by telephoning 01962 833620, emailing buy.with.confidence@hants.gov.uk or via the website www.buywithconfidence.gov.uk

Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 14 day cooling off period from the date the work starts. So, legally, you may have the right to cancel even though work has commenced.

Police Report for Kingsclere, Ashford Hill, Headley and Hannington

Total Crimes reported - 20

Incidents of note- There was a break to the Kingsclere Fire Station this month and an assortment of equipment was stolen from within. This incident is currently still under investigation and we do ask that anyone with any information does come forward by contacting 101.

There have recently been a few issues with the youths hanging around at the Fieldgate Centre engaging in anti social behaviour and potential drug use; we do ask that as parents you are aware of where your children are after dark. If anyone sees anyone acting anti social in the area then we do ask that this is reported through 101.

Non- Dwelling Burglaries – The series of non-dwelling breaks seems to have increased slightly since last month, targeting sheds and outbuildings.

Theft from vehicle - We have had a few incidents in the Swan Street and George Street area, where cars have been entered and have had items stolen from within. However we are happy to report that figures are less than last months. The Neighbourhood Policing Teams are regularly checking the vehicles parked in these areas and will write to any owners who have left valuables on display.

Speedwatch

Now the summer holidays are over, the SPEEDWATCH project has resumed in a new format, which it is hoped gain better results for analysis.

You may have noted that our Speed Indicating Device (SID) has been mounted 24/7 on the Basingstoke Road for the last few weeks. At first the device was not set to indicate vehicle speed so that we could gain an understanding of normal traffic speed. For the last 4 weeks the SID has been displaying speeds and we can confirm that the device is effective as average speeds have dropped almost 1mph. This may not sound a big improvement. However when you remember that the average speed is made up from every passing vehicle many of which observe the speed limit and therefore have no reason to slow down you can appreciate the difference.

Unfortunately there are a number of drivers who do not observe our speed limits at all, some (140 instances in 4 weeks) have been recorded travelling in excess of 50mph. The SID has been set up so that it does not display speeds above 50mph. Our local police have been provided with times and dates of all these occurrences in the hope that this helps with the identification of these individuals before the inevitable "accident" occurs.

The SID has now been located on the Newbury Road and will be moved on a regular basis to different locations around the village.



Nature Notes

Among the hotchpotch of ducks on the local lake recently there was one with a very strange swimming action. One wing was carried awkwardly very high on its back suggesting damage and that the bird would be unable to fly. On the same side the foot was trailing uselessly and therefore all the swimming work was being done by the sound foot. The bird had adjusted to the problem but it had resulted in a rocking motion.



All birds love to bathe, some geese even roll on their backs but several ducks were behaving in a manner not noticed before. Despite being dabbling ducks they were performing shallow dives, disappearing from sight and then exploding upwards to the surface before carrying out the usual wallowing and preening.

In September we had an opportunity to see some temporarily captive slow worms rescued from an unfavourable habitat. It was fascinating to watch two adults emerge from the shelters constructed for them to deal with slugs as they were offered. It seemed almost as though they could “taste” the slugs by flicking their very sensory tongues. The hapless prey was firmly grasped in the middle and gradually munched. A surprise came with the arrival of ten tiny threadlike babies –wonderfully independent and able to tackle small prey. Their golden bodies had a dark stripe along the back ending with a tiny black dot, star, or v shape on the head, each pattern was slightly different. As sunlight reached them they emerged to bask. They will be released to hibernate.


Lest We Forget

Two Brothers Killed


Second Lieutenant Eric Barnes was killed during the First Battle of Ypres, Belgium on Sunday, 1 November 1914 aged 20. He had left Sandhurst the previous May and was gazetted to the Lincolnshire Regiment. With his regiment he embarked for France in August in the British Expeditionary Force to support the French and Belgian armies. He is recorded on the Menin Gate.

Second Lieutenant Ralph Barnes was killed on Tuesday 30 October 1917 during the Third Battle of Ypres. The older brother of Eric, he trained as a solicitor and subsequently enlisted in the London Regiment [Post Office Rifles]. He is recorded on the Tyne Cot Memorial at Zonnebeke, Belgium. His father, John Barnes, who was Clerk to Kingsclere Rural District Council and held other offices in Kingsclere, outlived him by just six weeks.

As well as appearing on the Kingsclere War Memorial The two brothers are commemorated on a memorial stone just to the north of the west door in the churchyard.

When do you see any changes?

Advertising will not start until the new year (leading up to Christmas is not a time when potential Vicars look for new jobs - they are too busy!!). It will be Easter before any decisions are made, assuming all goes well. We know this all sounds amazingly slow but we have no choice locally over the time-table... It starts with the Archbishop of Canterbury and works its way back to the individual benefice.

And in the meantime: Please be reassured - all the normal activities of a church continue during a Vacancy period. Regular services on Sundays and ones such as weddings and funerals will be taken by visiting priests. Local lay worship leaders will continue to take monthly Sunday and other special services. Pastoral support will continue to be available from the pastoral care team. Home communion will continue to be available. All other activities, such as Prayer Groups, Choirs, ABC and Messy Church, Christingle, Carol Concerts, will all continue. Details will be available on the Kingsclere Woodlands web-site at www.clerewoodlands.org.uk or on church notice boards and in the pew slips to be found in all three churches.






