ROAD CLOSURE – REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 14TH **NOV-2021** – The Parish Council will be closing the roads to traffic in the centre of the village again this year for the Remembrance Walk along Swan Street and the Silence at 11am. We respectfully ask motorists to be mindful of this.

ANNUAL REPORT – The Annual Report 2021 has now been produced, printed, and is currently waiting to be delivered to all households in the village. At the time of writing it is hoped it will arrive through your letter boxes soon. The Parish Council wish to express thanks to all who contributed.

PARISH COUNCIL OFFICE OPENING HOURS – from November the office hours will change to Monday afternoons 2.30 – 4.30pm and Wednesday 10.00 – 12.00 noon. The Clerk can be contacted by phone Monday, Tuesday and Wednesdays and emails are monitored regularly throughout the week. There are occasions where the Clerk must go out and meet contractors or check issues in and around the village, but a notice will always be left advising on return if this has to occur during office opening. You are welcome to call ahead to check if a member of staff is present before visiting the office.

KPC MOWING AND MAINTENANCE CONTRACT RENEWAL— The current contract comes to the end of its three-year term next Spring. The Parish Council invites anyone who is interested in the contract and wishes to be included in the tender process to get in touch with the clerk who will then ensure the schedule and relevant paperwork is forwarded. The closing dates for tenders to be submitted is the 3rd January 2022 at 10am.

GREEN WHEELY BINS & GLASS RECYCLING – the collections dates are 3rd and 17th November and then 1st December. **Please ensure all bins are out by 7am.**

GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS - Last update from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council: 1 October 2021

Garden waste collections SUSPENDED. Due to the ongoing national shortage of HGV drivers, Basingstoke and Deane have had to take the difficult decision to temporarily suspend garden waste collections due from the week of Monday 4 October. This is to target our driver resources to protecting our core household waste and recycling collection services. We will review the situation regularly and hope that, if the HGV driver availability improves, we will be able to resume the service in November. The missed collections will be added to customers' accounts. To ensure that subscription records remain on the system to add this extension, it is important that customers renew their subscription quickly if they get a reminder.

GENERAL WHEELY BIN COLLECTION UPDATE from Basingstoke and Deane Website -

Crews are currently working hard to complete as many rounds as possible but owing to staffing issues around COVID, shortage of HGV drivers and sickness, some collections may not take place.

If this happens any outstanding work will be completed first. So if your collection is scheduled for today it may be collected later than usual. In some areas glass may be collected separately to allow the recycling crews to complete as many rounds as possible. Please continue to leave your bins or boxes out until they are collected.

If only your bin, rather than the whole street has been missed, please complete the online form found at www.basingstoke.gov.uk/bin collections. Please make sure you have your property number on your bin, as this helps our crews return it to the correct place after it has been emptied. We can send you bin stickers to write your property number on. Just complete the online sticker request form, again at

www.basingstoke.gov.uk/bincollections.

KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

It's been three years since our Neighbourhood Plan was approved. Since then, all planning applications

have been assessed against policies in the NP along with Basingstoke & Deane's Local Development Plan and to date we have been fortunate in preventing major development around our village. Along with policies in the Local Plan, our NP has prevented development outside the settlement policy boundary, including defeating an appeal for land at Cottismore Garden Centre being used as a park for shipping containers.

Since adoption of the Local Plan national policy has since changed and housing need is now set at a national level reflecting Government's intention to boost supply.

The Borough Council have therefore commenced a review of their Local Plan. The revised Plan will run from 2023 to 2039, an additional 10 years. Based on a longer plan period, the Borough's housing requirement would be 16,200 dwellings (900 x 18 years). The current target is 850 dwellings per annum. Unfortunately, this increase will affect Kingsclere and other settlements. At a recent meeting the Parish Council were informed by B&D that Kingsclere has an indicative allocation of an additional 175 homes. The final figure could be more or less, but we will not know until Spring 2022 when B&D publish the consultation on the revised Local Plan. Rather than leave all decisions on development to the Borough Council, the Parish Council have advised B&D that we wish to allocate any additional housing through the Neighbourhood Planning process so that residents can have their say. We already know that developers are interested in sites at Porch Farm, Yew Tree Farm and Gaily Mill.

There is little we can do until the revised Local Plan consultation is published next Spring. In the meantime, the Parish Council urge all residents to keep up to date with information published by B&D and the Parish Council, including PC minutes which can be found on the PC website.

Flu Clinics Patients Over 65 will be able to have their Flu vaccine and Covid Booster at the same time at *Jameson House. Patients who do not wish to have a Flu and Covid booster at the same time will need to wait a clear 7 days between having these vaccines if they have them at the alternative pharmacies.

Under-65 clinics for patients with Underlying Health Conditions will be offered a vaccination at Kingsclere or Overton. We will contact patients as vaccine supplies become available.

Blood Bottle Supplies The situation due to a lack of blood bottle supplies has now eased. We are working through the backlog that was created. We would urge any patients who may be concerned that they have missed an important blood test, to contact us.

The Health Service and GP Practice We have recently posted an NHS document on our website "Why are GP practices still working differently? The pandemic is not over. GP practices have been working hard all through the pandemic to continue delivering services to people.

Our patient numbers have gone up from around 18,000 (pre-pandemic) to 18,541, due to new housing. We have taken on additional salaried doctors over the last 2 years and use locums when doctors are on leave. We now have 1 additional doctor than before the pandemic.

Despite the additional posts within our Practice and PCN Team, demand is still out stripping pre-Covid levels. Daily Appointments pre-Covid were around 280 per day, now running at an average of 370-380 per day (a 30%) increase). Some days this increases to 410-420.

Since Covid occurred we have much higher requirements on practices as regards seeing suspect Covid patients in an appropriately secure area, total triage and a higher level of hygiene arrangements between clinicians seeing patients.

We hope this corrects some of the scare stories in the media and we would assure all our patients that WDH is open, the team are seeing patients Face to Face and that we are here for you.

Nature Notes

We walked out to Cottington Ridge recently and, returning along the Hannington Track, were pleasantly surprised at the improvement. From a track with a scant bush or two, there is now a flourishing, well developed, mixed hedge along the track edge running down the slope to the valley floor. We were



particularly pleased as some years ago we were part of a small group of volunteers planting the flimsy wands and wouldn't have put much on their survival. On the other side of the track a flower bank has been established where once a bare field edge had been. The flower show is largely over but there are still flashes of crimson from poppies and sky blue from chicory.

The poet describes autumn as a season of 'mellow fruitfulness' and certainly it is proving to be so with an abundance of windfalls. Strangely, the usual hordes of wasps gorging on the sweet juices are noticeably absent. A kind offer from a resident to harvest a glut of damsons resulted in several visits and bruised fruit underfoot was similarly devoid of wasps. Although often regarded as the 'bad boys' of the insect world wasps are carnivorous and fulfil a useful role in pest control.

While nuts and berries are plentiful the acorn harvest is poor according to a radio report. An important winter food for jays, it has been estimated that one bird can cache up to 5,000 acorns in cracks, crevices, under pebbles and buried. Very many will be recovered as jays have good memories, lost acorns often become new trees.

It is 21 years since Betty Shaw wondered if we would like to take on Nature Notes for The Tower and we have got the hang of it now but if at times certain subjects appear to have been covered previously, please remember that by and large, Nature is very constant!

Reflections

They'd hit rock bottom. There was no way out. They were stuck. The smell of sweat, disinfectant, oil, tea, rum and more was barely tolerable.

Nauseousness, hearts racing, and fierce headaches were predominat feelings. What could they do?



So felt the 59 crew of HMS Seal on the 5th May 1940, stuck at the bottom of the sea in a strait between Denmark and Sweden. It was the submariner's worst nightmare. Forced to dive to avoid enemy fire, evading them for hours, the submarine sadly got caught in a mooring cable of a sea mine, the stern being seriously damaged by the explosion, and stuck in the mud at the bottom of the sea.

One final attempt was to be made to reach the surface. After 23 hours, the captain, Rupert Lonsdale, announced to the control room, "We have run out of ideas. So I am going to call the crew together and we shall say some simple prayers. Our object will be to ask God to help us". This captain believed Jesus' words that "All things are possible with God".

The crew gathered, all bar two men, and Captain Lonsdale prayed, finishing his prayer with "Please, O Lord, deliver us". They then prayed the Lord's Prayer, and concluded with quiet personal prayers.

For the final attempt, a rope was tied to the front of the submarine which was raised 25 degrees off the surface, and all men were commanded to climb up the rope into the front compartments. It was a feeble attempt to use the men as ballast. They did so, struggling weakly to get there under the strain of lack of oxygen, most having already reconciled themselves with their impending slow death.

The final order was given; the last two tanks blown and engines ran at maximum power, and, incredibly, Seal broke free from the seabed and slowly rose to the surface.

Though the submarine was stranded, a sitting duck, in enemy waters, and the whole crew including the captain surrendered, they lived. After the war, having spent 5 years in prison camps, Lonsdale and many of his crew were released. The captain and many others had witnessed a dramatic answer to prayer.

Those prayers were heard, and ours can be too as we lay our concerns and challenges before God, who is good and longs to hear and respond to our prayers.

Are you finding it increasingly difficult to live in this 'online' world? You are not alone.



As a charity supporting disabled people in Basingstoke, we are seeing a sharp increase in

the digital divide, of older people and those with a disability being 'left behind'.

Basingstoke & District Disability Forum (BDDF)'s services are all free and available to anyone with a disability, visible or invisible. If you feel you will benefit from what we do, then we are here to help you.

Since the outbreak of the pandemic services have been forced to move online, not just for BDDF but for every charity and business in the world. For people who do not have access to a computer, this can be a very lonely, isolating experience.

At BDDF we are working hard to reach our members who do not have computer skills, or who are lacking digital confidence. During September and October, we have been running a five-week basic IT course at the Basing-stoke Discovery Centre. Our learners are discovering how to send emails, safely shop online, join video calls so that they can see loved ones, and search the web.

Some of our learners didn't have access to any technology at home, so we teamed up with BVA's Reboot IT scheme to offer free refurbished laptops to those who would otherwise not have the means to buy one.

We have some more funding to help more disabled and older people to get connected. If you or someone you know needs our help, please contact us on 01256 423869 or email info@bddf.org.uk. As soon as we have enough people interested, we will work with our partners to deliver a further basic IT course to teach them the skills they need to get online. For those who simply could not afford to buy a computer we will refer them to obtain one free of charge, subject to availability.

November in the Garden

Sadly the autumn colour has gone from the garden leaving only berries, evergreens and any trees that have a decorative bark.

One of the jobs that can be terribly boring is to rake up the fallen leaves. If left they will harbour unwelcome creatures. If you are unable to collect all the leaves, the worms will do a very good job of taking care of them, but of course it is better to collect most of the leaves and use them to make leaf mould. This will take probably a year if left in the dark e.g. a bag or bin.

With the wind that can turn into gales at this time of the year, it is essential to tie in climbers as they can become damaged. I like to half prune my roses as this helps to stop them rocking with the wind, leaving the complete pruning until April. It is also a good time to check tree ties and stakes.

Roses and most deciduous trees and shrubs can be planted now. Bare rooted plants work well as they are better value for money than container grown plants.

There are a few plants that can be cut back at the moment. Grasses and bamboos can be and also herbaceous plants, although some people like to leave them as they feel that they look attractive when they become frosted. Of course if you have a large garden this will be leaving too much tidying up until the spring which will be hard work.

The vegetable garden can be dug over to allow the frost to break the soil up. If you grow Brussel sprouts, keep harvesting, picking from the bottom as the largest sprouts form at the base of the plant first. Any brassicas that are still growing will need netting as the pigeons will enjoy feasting on them.

Cauliflowers will need the curds protected. Do this by folding the inner leaves over the top to keep them white.

The garden shed will probably need tidying up before it gets too cold, making room for the garden tools that should be cleaned, oiled, and stored until the spring.

It's getting to the end of the time for planting tulips. This is best done by the end of the month, but early December at the very latest. Don't forget to give them plenty of grit as they like good drainage.

Now that the shorter days are here it's time to look through the seed catalogues. Planning next year in your garden, it's always good to try and grow something different.

The berries are rather good this year. I'm sure the birds will have a feast on them at some stage, but before that happens just enjoy the show. I can't remember seeing so many berries on the rowan trees and the pyracanthas.
