Covid Vaccination Spring Booster

The Spring Booster programme started at the beginning of April 2023. Local centres started offering vaccinations from 17 April 2023 and will continue until the end of June 2023. We have invited our eligible patients (75+) by Text to book an appointment via the HIOW call centre (0300 561 0018) or the National Booking system. Please note that the practice cannot directly book patients into this service. Other eligible patients will be notified in due course.

Use of On-line Services

Please be aware that the number of On-line services providers continues to increase. WDH have no control over providers or services offered to patients. We have become aware recently of patients that have inadvertently clicked on links to private/fee-pay services due to how "private work" was presented on the same web page as our GP practice booking information. This is outside our control. All services that Watership Down Health offer patients, such as consultations with GPs and blood tests, are free at the point of delivery. Please be mindful when clicking on *private services*: patients only go ahead if they wish to sign up for private services as there will be a charge.

Blood Pressure Monitoring

A blood pressure test is a simple way of checking if blood pressure is too high or too low. Blood pressure tests can be carried out at a local pharmacy and GP practice, or even in some opticians and supermarkets. Each of the Watership Down Health waiting rooms has a blood pressure monitoring machine. Patients can take a reading and then give to Reception for it to be added to the patient's record.

Home blood pressure monitoring enables patients with hypertension (high blood pressure) to measure their blood pressure readings with their GP from home using a patient's own digital blood pressure monitor. There are a variety of low-cost blood pressure monitors available. Please help by giving us your readings regularly. Beyond Easter

One of the Bible readings suggested for the Sunday after Easter is part of Peter's first letter to the early church which includes these words:

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead... (1 Peter 1:3-9)

Further on in the same letter, he writes:

"... in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an account of the hope that is in you;" (1 Peter 3:15)

It seems to me that Peter is setting out how he envisages the early church should respond to the resurrection of Jesus and how that will play out in the years to come: it is to be something shared with others, an experience that will bring hope. An experience that so many of us are still searching for today as we watch the global news unfolding or read the latest examples of humanity's dehumanising actions towards members of the same human race.

The Easter experience remains a lifelong one. It is an account of re-appearance, re-acquainting and re-affirming, as experienced by Mary and the women who came to the tomb early in the morning; by Thomas who was not to be fobbed off with a second-hand experience of the risen Christ, by the other disciples and by Peter who, despite his numerous denials of his links with Jesus, was still entrusted with the pastoral care of the early church.

The experience of joy, encouragement and forgiveness which was shared on that first Easter Day remains accessible to all who still seek it today. It offers a different way of looking at the world; of building up rather than belittling; of love rather than hate. It is a way of living and loving that offers each of us a new start, not just once, but each and every day of our lives...

May In The Garden

The garden should be looking its best this month, the trees will be in full leaf giving a good background to the gardens. The late flowering bulbs will be giving a good show: tulips, alliums, camassia and bluebells. No matter how many bluebells I dig up from the garden they still multiply. They look beautiful in a woodland setting, but I do not recommend them in the flower border, just too vigorous for my taste. Primula Denticulata is a favourite of mine that flowers this month, but unfortunately they do not perform well in our soil.

Clematis will also be flowering now. There are many varieties and they will all need to be cut back at different times, always read the label when purchasing the plant. Clematis plants can suffer from clematis wilt - the plant looks to be dying. I had this happen a few years ago. I solved the problem by digging up the plant and replanting it in another part of the garden where it flourished. Clematis plants do not like too much sun on their roots and dislike drying out. We have one in the garden with the roots underwater for several months in the winter. It continues to flower beautifully each year in the Summer.

With the longer days, it gives us the chance to get more jobs done. The early flowering shrubs will need to be cut back to encourage new growth and keep the plants controlled. Some shrubs will grow huge if left uncut. One of those shrubs that can become very large is lilac, so cut back now after flowering.

Lots of other jobs to do now. Hoe the soil to kill weed seedlings. Keep mowing and feeding the lawns. Watch out for pests and diseases, try not to use chemicals as they not only kill the pests but also the good insects. If you own a pond, remove any pond weed regularly otherwise it will take over.

Formal evergreen hedging can be trimmed e.g. box. Unfortunately, the dreaded moth has attacked the box plants in this area. Sadly, it can only be treated with a chemical. After spraying cut out the affected area and hope that new growth will appear.

Herbaceous plants and climbers will need support, taking care not to damage plants when tying in and staking. Sweet peas will need attention regularly as they grow so vigorously. Plant out hardy annuals in the borders. Remember to keep dead heading, this will prolong the flowering period.

Sow runner and French beans, plant leeks, sow chard and leaf beet. Plant marrows and courgettes. These like plenty of water and good soil enriched with organic matter. Net brassicas, as the cabbage white butterfly will feast on them, as will pigeons. Protect strawberries with straw to keep the fruits from being damaged.

The plants sold at the Plant Sale in May (held in the church grounds) are probably worth investing in. Most will have come from local gardens which will make the plants more reliable, as they will be plants that tolerate our soil conditions. Take a look as you may find something interesting.

In T.S. Eliot's poem *The Wasteland* April is described as

"the cruellest month breeding Lilacs out of the dead land, mixing Memory and desire stirring Dull roots with spring rain."

It's true that April's welcome warm sunshine can tempt us out of our winter layers only to be curtly reminded of bitter gusts and freezing rain, but I will happily withstand those brisk reminders of winter's lingering embrace, if the trade off is the joy of seeing spring emerge and blossom.

Buds: I've been scouring branches for them for weeks, excited to watch them swell with the promise of colour and scent. Tulips have shot up in ranks of poised swords, with slithers of red, pink and yellow teasing through their green cases.

Along the steam, iris reach up from the shallows. The willow's yellow catkins lengthen into a frozen golden shower. Hedges are fattening up again - a relief to those of us who prefer more privacy in our gardens and driveways.

Walking with another mum at Basildon park, we are surprised by two blue tits so engrossed in their battle for territory that they tumble through the air, twisting together to within inches of our prams. The quiet of the garden is often interrupted by the clatter of wings of amorous collared doves.



Our toddler wakes us very early one morning and we spot a hedgehog snuffling around the wild part of the garden. It is possible he is awake too soon in the year, encouraged by the recent uptake in temperatures.



The late frosts may yet chasten our eagerness for spring. Eliot may be right; perhaps April is too soon to surface from the warm earth. But here - a Red Admiral butterfly lands in my path and suns itself - a symbol of confident hope that the season has well and truly changed.
