**FAWCONER ROAD DEVELOPMENT SITE** – Thank you to the 68 residents who attended the exhibition at the Village Club on Monday 1st July where representatives from David Wilson Homes and Savills were there to discuss the proposed development at Fawconer Road.

Feedback from residents will inform amendments to the scheme prior to the outline planning application being submitted to Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council, and will be included in a Statement of Community Involvement that will accompany the application.

One of the queries raised by residents was the traffic survey strip across the road. A number of people commented that it is south of Fawconer Road and therefore not picking up traffic turning left onto Ashford Hill Road. DWH have checked with their highways engineer and this strip was monitoring traffic speeds over a 7 day period to inform the visibility splay required for vehicles exiting the site. An additional survey has already been carried out at the Ashford Hill Road/A339 junction to monitor all traffic movements using that junction.



## Reflections



I wonder whether you've ever experienced a violent storm. This summer we've had a few in Britain with various events being cancelled particularly in Cornwall, where we had a quite damp (yet enjoyable) family holiday last month. But it's another storm that will forever be etched in my memory. When I was a child, we used a camp in North Wales on a little peninsula connected to the mainland via a causeway. It's called Shell Island because of the number of shells which wash up on the beach there. One day we went for a long walk and on our return we were caught in an awful downpour. I remember my sister and I sheltering behind a giant boulder the mainland side of the causeway while my parents tried to flag a car down to take us across the causeway. It was dark and cold but then someone stopped and got us back to the island and to our tent which thankfully kept most of the wind and rain out. I guess we shivered as our parents dried us down and put us in bed, to sleep very well that night!

I write this having thought on another storm on the first day of our summer holiday club. We had a great time learning about when Jesus and the disciples were out on the Sea of Galilee and got caught in a storm. As the disciples, some of them seasoned fishermen, panicked and were wracked with fear, Jesus slept on a cushion in the stern. Finally they woke him and said "Teacher, don't you care that we are perishing?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!". And as He did that, a great calm descended. The disciples were amazed, saying "Who then is this that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

As we thought about that event, we were reminded that God is able to deal with our fears and worries. We were able to physically see these worries dissolve as we poured water on dissolvable paper. And Jesus doesn't only do that for holiday club children but for all. He can take our worries and fears and deal with them, leaving us with a deep sense of peace and calm. Why not ask Him into your situation and see how He can do this in your life even today?

#### Changes to St Mary's Church Interior

It seems the months just fly by and it's time to prepare another update on what's happening with the proposed changes to the church.

The plans have been on display inside the West Door for nearly two months and I know from comments and conversations I have had that people are interested and have particular ideas and views about what we are considering.

Tradition plays a big part in what people want to see, moving the font, replacing the pews and changing the current layout and how we envisage the use of the building in the years to come have produced the most responses.

We must be sympathetic to the past and yet be prepared to see change where necessary and to bring the building and its facilities fit for current purpose.

Our meeting with the church authorities in July produced helpful and constructive comments and has made us look again at some of the changes we wanted to make but overall, they were supportive of the majority of the current plan.

The email address created for your suggestions and ideas has now closed and the committee intend to meet to discuss and amend the plans where possible or where the strength of concerns was such that we could not ignore your comments.

It is intended that we will submit draft plans and our draft Statement of Need and Statement of Significance to the DAC Office (The Diocese planning authority) in October 2019

We hope that it will be considered at a meeting during the latter part of this year and any part of our plan not appropriate or requiring change will be returned to us for amendment by the Project Team and our architect.


Its still got a long way to the final plan stage but we hope that after the DAC committee have given us guidance on any changes, they need to see we will be in a position to show the final plan and start the next, more technical stage, of plans which can then be costed.

Whilst this is happening, we will be looking at how we will fund the work, applying for grants and funding from individuals and organisations.

Thank you to all those people who have sent emails, your comments will be considered and discussed. The team hope to have the opportunity to meet and discuss the emails personally with all the contributors as we move the project forward to a conclusion.



#### **Nature Notes**

Convolvulus, Bindweed, Cornbine, call it what you will is a real nuisance in the garden, it chokes weak plants with its clinging, smothers foliage, infiltrates flowering bushes and, at this time of the year, seems to grow a mile-a-minute. Not welcome! However, change the scene:- There is an ash hedge locally which has a dense covering of bindweed on top of which is a wonderful display of large white cone flowers which are festooned along its length, A lovely sight and a wild flower doing what comes naturally.

We went to The Countryfile Show at Blenheim again recently. One of the exhibitors was B.T.O. (British Trust for Ornithology) and they were demonstrating bird ringing. They had just netted a young kingfisher and were assessing it, part of which was to weigh it. We were surprised to see the bird placed in a scale pan on its back and the handler's hand removed, it lay there so calmly. Young kingfisher beaks are green/black.

It was a surprise to see the hedgehog, which visits regularly, completely ignore three large slugs one evening. A hedgehog expert explained that the large amount of slime that they produce makes them an also that a hedgehog's relatively small mouth would be unable to cope with prey of this size. The small slugs that do the real damage to our plants are preferred.



Hedgehog courtship is a protracted affair where the sow snorts and puffs while keeping her back protected and the boar pursues stately circles around her. An hour of this can result in both then going their separate ways.

A pair of juvenile terns appear to be the successful outcome of the adults seen occupying the nesting raft on one of the lakes we visit
