

## Crime

Every month PCSO Emma Page produces a breakdown of local crime (see page 6) which is always of interest. I normally think crime is something that happens elsewhere, however, McColls and Swan Street Stores have had major incidents in the recent past.

Reading through Emma's contribution for this month, I was struck by the fact that 30 crimes were recorded for Kingsclere (including Ashford Hill, Hannington and Headley) during May. Looking at the figures for the first 5 months of the last 3 years, crime is up this year in Kingsclere compared to the previous 2 years. Is it a worry? Possibly not though it is a concern when you see 17 incidents of anti-social behaviour in one month. However with a low crime rate a few individuals can skew the statistics. The crime statistic for Basingstoke and Deane actually show a drop in anti-social behaviour.

## First World War Centenary in Kingsclere November 2018

Kingsclere will be marking the centenary of the end of World War 1 in November 2018. More details will appear later in The Tower, but here is advance information of the things which will be happening:



### Remembrance Sunday Parade - 11 November.

This will, as always, be the centrepiece of the commemorations. Over the weekend, Kingsclere Bellringers will be ringing in a coordinated UK wide event.

Kingsclere Film Club will screen a **WW1 film** on 3 November.

Kingsclere Library will host a talk on **WW1** on 8 November.

## KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN



By the time you read this, the finalised Neighbourhood Plan should be available to view on both our own and Basingstoke & Deane's web sites. This will be the Plan that you will be asked to vote on in the Parish referendum so if you have previous editions of the Plan, please destroy them.

The Borough Council do not organise elections and referendums during the months of July and August. Although at the time of writing we are waiting for the Borough Council to confirm the date, the referendum looks likely to be held during the first or second week of September.

Following the independent examiner's report, four policies have been removed from the Plan as they didn't add any local policy detail above that contained in policies in Basingstoke & Deane's Local Plan. These were policies on infrastructure readiness; change of use of local shops, pubs and businesses; conserving and enhancing biodiversity; and ensuring the use of native plants (although part of this policy has been added to our policy on protecting mature trees and hedgerows). This brings the total number of policies in the plan to 22 along with 4 projects for the Parish Council to take forward. The Parish Council urges all residents to read the Plan prior to the referendum.

## Police Report May 2018

In the month of May there was 30 incidents (21 in Kingsclere, 3 in Headley, 3 in Ashford Hill and 3 in Hannington) which have been classified as crimes by The Home Office.

Current Neighbourhood Priorities are:

1. Burglary Residential / Burglary Business/Community
2. Traffic Related Incidents
3. Theft
4. Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)
5. Criminal Damage

### Burglary Residential

There have been four reported this month. A shed was broken into and a number of tools were stolen in North Oakley. A property was broken into on Popes Hill and a number of items stolen and two vehicles parked in a barn at Plastow Green were damaged by keying.

### Burglary Business/Community

There has been one reported this month. A group of males entered McColls in Swan Street and stole the cash machine using power tools.

### Traffic Incidents

There have been two reported this month. One was a damage only road traffic collision near Wolverton and the other a minor injury road traffic collision on the B3051.

### Theft from Vehicle

There has been one reported this month. Entry was gained into a vehicle on Fieldgate Drive and a number of items were stolen.

### Theft

There have been six reported this month. A phone was stolen from a business in George Street. Lead was stolen from a property on Foxs Lane. Batteries were stolen from two sets of temporary traffic lights on Little Knowle Hill and Ashford Hill Road. A Sundial was stolen from a garden on Popes Hill. An old basin was stolen from a driveway in King John Road (an attempt was made to steal some items from a nearby skip prior to this) and there was one make off without payment at the Kingsclere Filling Station.



### Criminal Damage

There have been seven incidents reported this month.

A window was smashed on a vehicle parked in Winchester Road. A number plate was destroyed on a vehicle parked in Garrett Close. Stones were thrown at a property in North Street as well as threats to damage windows. An attempt was made to access a van via the rear doors in Strokins Road. A window was smashed on a vehicle parked in Longcroft Road and a brick was thrown at a vehicle on the A339.

### Anti-Social Behaviour

There have been seventeen reported incidents this month. Of note, youths have been on the roof at Kingsclere Primary School and a number of reports were received regarding a group of youths causing a nuisance in North Street. One was formally dealt with by Police.

### Suspicious Incidents

There have been seven reported this month. In particular a vehicle with a trailer was seen acting suspiciously outside Ashford Hill Primary School. A male visited a property in Longcroft Road saying he was fundraising for Naomi House. He asked for bank details which were not provided. A male knocked on a door on Ashford Hill Road wanting to sell some items after being released from prison. They are what are known as "Nottingham Knockers". **REMEMBER** if cold callers don't get any sales in your area, they are less likely to return.



## Nature Notes

We had a break in late April in Andalucia, the Atlantic part of Spain. It was an unknown area to us and really impressed. Locally was 17km of beach with a protected dune system. Footpaths at intervals allowed access to the sands and everywhere were stone pines (umbrella pines), a source of pine nuts. However, our main interest was to do some birdwatching and in this we were not disappointed. Nearby, were extensive disused salt pans which attracted a host of waders but also harriers, pratincoles, Caspian terns and on a track, bee eaters and golden orioles. A little further afield lay a national park which had vast marsh areas inhabited by a dream collection of waders and other birds. Our guide was excellent and we were in the company of birders with encyclopaedic knowledge. Semi-wild herds of horses roam the marshes and we were privileged to see them at full gallop with their foals, throwing up spray as they sped by. An odorous pony carcass was visible above the water on the top of which stood a griffon vulture vainly trying to make an opening while a bunch of its compatriots stood nearby ready to move in. This spring, two tit nestboxes were visited by prospective tenants but unusually, remained unoccupied. Happily, the garden is resounding to the chirps of visiting tit fledglings as they call to be fed. A prime attraction this year appears to be fat balls usually only offered in winter. At first chicks were fed with beakfuls of fat by the adults but now juveniles are feeding from the same source independently. The question arises as to whether this is a suitable diet and will there be huge, obese adults struggling to get into birdboxes next year. Hopefully not!



## St Mary's Church The Building Inside and Outside

Now is a good time to bring everyone up to date with what is happening to St Mary's.

**Inside** 'The Good News' After a tender process, the PCC has recently appointed PHD to redecorate the inside of the main church building. This work is scheduled to start in late October and should be finished early in the New Year. This is following a major rewiring and lighting project last year.



In addition, we are about to upgrade the audio system and are looking into ways in which we can improve the use of audio-visual in our services.

**Outside** 'The Bad News' As those of you who pass the church will know, we have had a major slippage of the roof tiles on the North face of the chancel roof.

Sorry about the scaffolding but one of its main functions is to stop any falling tiles from 'bopping' a passer-by on the head. It looks as if we may have to retille the whole of that face, but we are awaiting our expert's advice. We are not sure on timings but work will commence as soon as possible.

**How Much?** The estimated cost of redecoration is around £30,000. We don't have the exact cost of the re-roofing yet but we would be happy to have change from £15,000. It might all depend on what we uncover as we start work on replacing the roof tiles. St Mary's is, as ever, profoundly grateful to **The Friends of St Mary's (FOSM)** for their ongoing support on maintaining the fabric of the church.




