They claim that generally households tend to use 10%-18% less water when on a meter and it is considered to be a fairer way to charge as we only pay for the water we use. Customers will be provided with written information about their meter and metered billing but people will also have the opportunity to talk to advisors face to face who will be working with the roadside installation teams. 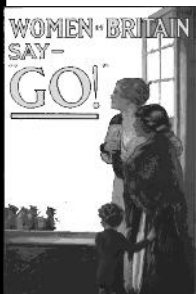

Nature Notes

Most people know that moss grows on the north side of trees, but is it a reliable fact? Moss as a living plant, likes to spread itself around and is very often found on west and east sides of a trunk also. So at best, it is a very rough guide. One tree seen recently had a cut off point beyond which no moss grew, as if a clean line had been drawn down its trunk. Proof that moss favours a northerly aspect is to be seen on a porch in Newbury. The sides of the pitched roof face exactly N. and S. and on the north side there is a total covering of thick moss whilst on the other, the tiles are completely clear.

Winter floods have deposited a mass of vegetation on the lower structure of a bridge over the Kennet. Himalayan balsam seeds lodged there are germinating and growing. Hopefully, without soil, the seedlings will not survive to disperse more seeds of this very invasive plant.

Jackdaws had pecked a hole in the wire net feeder. A patch was made with fine wire mesh but a woodpecker chick and adults have made holes in it already, they are however wonderful to watch.

Collared doves are minimalists when it comes to nests. We watched helplessly as a pair attempted to build on the attachment of a satellite dish. As each twig offered up fell to the ground even longer ones arrived. At some point they accepted defeat leaving a pile of twigs on the paving below.

What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

Every year, around 26,000 children in Hampshire take part in the national Summer Reading Challenge, which is run by a charity called the Reading Agency. Every year there is a different theme – in 2013 it was ‘Creepy House’. The aim of the challenge is to get children aged 4 to 11 to read six books from their local library during the summer holidays. It is all free and the children collect fun materials along the way and receive a medal and certificate if read all 6 books! The Reading Agency now run a Summer Reading Challenge website for children that is available throughout the year. It has competitions and book recommendations, and children can rate books and add reviews. Everything is closely monitored by the Reading Agency, so it is completely safe for children and will encourage them to not only read more, but find ideas for new authors and titles.

During the summer holidays there will be “Do It Yourself” craft table for you to make in the library or to take home to do.

Adults are not forgotten, there will be a mythical maze challenge for you to so as well!
