#### On the Frontline

The Church has always run courses at different times of the year to inform, educate and importantly to get together for fellowship. It is good to discuss our faith and learn from each other more about God. We are all very different and together we can open each other's eyes to different things. It has been said that faith can be like a washing line, we worship on a Sunday and feel lifted up and then as the week goes on we start to sag until next Sunday when we are lifted up in our faith again. Getting together in the week acts like a prop and lifts our saggy middle, so to speak.

Some churches have house groups that meet in the week to serve this purpose. However, that can be difficult with our busy lives and our differing working patterns. Yet, now and again, it is good to book out time in the diary to embark on joining others one evening a week to learn and talk about the Christian faith

#### **Nature Notes**

On a recent trip to Sicily we were on the upper slopes of Mt. Etna seeing little due to heavy drizzle. However, in the gloom, we spotted plants familiar to us growing out of the volcanic grit; dock, verbascum, senecio, valerian and achillea some in bloom and some carrying lady-



birds. These were too small to be the invasive harlequin type and were much more like our seven-spot. We failed to find out what they were feeding on but presumably aphids.

What a bumper crop of wild fruit and nuts the year has provided, acorns especially and jays will not go hungry this Winter. Sloes, hips, haws, hazel nuts and beechmast are also abundant.

On a circular walk with Douai Abbey at its centre, we came across a shooting party with a difference. Three ladies were out with their dogs strung in-line across a field with one safety man near the footpath and another man, the instructor, at the other end of the line. The dogs were to heel and the instructor hurled a lure forward into the long grass sometimes making a whirring sound with his tongue (mimicking a partridge's flight?) One dog would be despatched to find the lure and to return it. The line advanced a few paces and the procedure repeated with a different dog-not always successfully.

Where the school playing fields had been there was as superb stand of sunflowers and bright yellow corn marigolds looking wonderful in the early autumn sunshine.

#### WHAT IS HAPPENING TO OUR GAILEY BROOK?

Recently, I watched a programme entitled "Britain's Wildlife Revival", which dealt specifically with riverside wildlife. The rivers and streams in the UK, and the wildlife that lives in or near these waterways, are the "lifeblood" of our country. According to the Environment Agency, waterways need to be respected, protected and improved for our benefit and for future generations. This agency also sets out some of the responsibilities of a riverside property owner. If you own a property alongside a water course, e.g. our Kingsclere stream, the Galley Brook, you are a "riparian owner".

Some of your responsibilities are:

- 1) maintaining river beds and banks.
- 2) allowing the flow of water to pass without obstruction and
- 3) controlling invasive and alien species, such as Japanese knotweed.

Also, you should not use riverbanks to dispose of garden or other waste, where it could fall into the stream.

#### SO, WHAT IS HAPPENING TO OUR GAILEY BROOK?

From Gailey Mill, through Winchester Road, Bear Hill, Swan Street, Fox's Lane, Pope's Hill, Cedar Drive, North Street and Union Lane, through to Island Mill and on to Nutkins Farm and Alderbrook House, the stream has become choked and overgrown.

PLEASE, if YOU live in one of our riverside properties, will you honour your riparian duties and clean up the stream before it is too late?
