Community priorities

The current neighbourhood priority is burglary.

The number of burglary reports has been low throughout August, albeit there have been cases of opportunist theft in other adjacent areas. Tractor parts have been stolen from Binley, and garage breaks have been reported at Wells Lane in Whitchurch, and in Laverstoke.

On 1 August, a burglary was reported at Franklin Avenue in Tadley. Five days later, a property was broken into in Sydmonton. The latter incident occurred during the morning. The resident reported seeing an old Land Rover driving around in suspicious circumstances.

Now that summer is coming to an end, why not take the opportunity to make security marks on your garden machinery and lawnmowers before you put them away? You should also check if the access to you garden is secure. For further security, consider putting alarms on your outbuildings.

Theft in rural car parks update

We have continued to receive reports of goods being stolen from vehicles parked in rural car parks at Beacon Hill, White Hill, Jonathan Hill and Sydmonton. The vehicles are targeted when people leave them there to go walking. Not all cases result in property being stolen. Please make sure it's obvious that there is nothing in your vehicle. We will continue to patrol the car parks.

Did you know?

We have been running a 'Paint it Pink' campaign for batteries. To prevent the large batteries from being stolen, paint them pink. This makes it easier Continued on next page...

for them to be identified as stolen goods. Hampshire Police have urged scrap metal merchants to reject and report any pink batteries that are offered to them.

Parish news: Kingsclere, Headley and Ashford Hill

There have been no burglary reports in the area in August. This has been a relief, as in July there were break-ins reported involving garages and allotment sheds.

The post office in Headley reported an incident in which people tried to confuse staff at the shop. It is suspected that this was an attempt to steal money from the shop.

We received report of people acting suspiciously, when a white Mercedes Sprinter van was seen driving around the area. It is suspected they were checking out properties. A digger has been interfered with at a property in the area. This follows on from several thefts in July where batteries were among the items stolen.

Nature Notes

We stood close to a male blackcap watching him eagerly feasting on blackberries and totally ignoring our presence. Was he stocking up ready for migration or, increasingly, preparing to stay here to over winter? Their summer diet is mainly insects but they switch in late summer to take advantage of the energy in sugary fruits.



A very large moth was disturbed when curtains were drawn back. It was delta winged, almost a regular triangle the base of which was frilly and the overall colour was dark brown with even darker markings on the wings. An authority identified it as being an Old Lady Moth, common apparently but a first for us.

It is not uncommon to find buzzard wing feathers when the birds moultlarge brown and cream feathers barred with darker brown but where do kites moult? We have found only one feather in many years of looking. Surely such large birds must cast flight feathers somewhere.

Great crested grebes were seen in September still feeding two stripy chicks, presumably from a second brood. The young birds showed no sign of diving for themselves but eagerly received food from their parents.



The Church Pages

Fifty years ago someone did something that no-one had ever done before. It was a completely unique event in the history. of humanity. It was watched by millions and, once achieved, caused great celebration, though even today there are some conspiracy theorists who doubt it ever happened. I'm talking of course of the landing on the moon in July 1969, when Neil Armstrong uttered those famous words, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind".

But I've been reminded regularly by one of my daughters that the second man on the moon was called 'Buzz', Buzz Aldrin. And he did something which might have seemed quite out of place surrounded by state of the art technology, in fact, so much so that the radio was silent and NASA didn't reveal what he did at the time. It emerged later that in his personal items taken on the mission, he had with him a small piece of bread, a little chalice and a small amount of wine. In the hour preceding the moon walk, while Armstrong watched on, Aldrin poured the wine into the chalice. In one sixth gravity, Aldrin later recounted how the wine curled slowly and gracefully up the side of the cup. Aldrin then read some words of Jesus from the book of John in the Bible, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, will bear much fruit, for you can do nothing without me." Reading this just before stepping out on the moon was a reminder to Aldrin that he needed to stay in touch not only with Houston, or with his fellow astronaut, Neil, but also with Jesus, his Lord. It was an assertion that he was only a branch connected to the vine and that he needed the strength and the power of the vine to fulfil the task before him. Shortly after taking the bread and wine, he would step out on the moon's surface only 19 minutes behind Armstrong.

I'm not sure what you've got on your plate at the moment. Are things manageable or do they seem so daunting, that a moon-walk seems more achievable. Whatever you're facing, I believe that Jesus is able to give you strength and courage when you feel like shrinking back. Step out and connect into the vine.

Changes to St Mary's Church Interior

The current status of work on our plans has been a little slow over the last month.

Its mainly due to holidays and taking into account all the information we have been getting from our email survey and additional feed back we received from our discussions and meetings with people and organisations in the village.

A lot of the work is now centred on getting our Statement of Need and Statement of Significance prepared for presentation to the church planning committee (DAC) for consideration by their panel of experts and other interested parties.

It is designed to make sure we have given consideration to the building, its contents, its history, opinions of the community and the future use of the church as a community building.

In order to proceed with some of the work there will be exploratory work carried out in the coming weeks. We need to check the surface water drains and when dealing with a building without a damp-proof course we need to make sure that any existing damp problems are sorted out before we start major work on the interior.

The modern world demands high standards of toilet, catering facilities heating and lighting which means we must establish what we have before we can move forward and so the list goes on!

I know that a lot of people in the village are interested in our progress with the reordering and I hope these updates are not only of interest, but give reassurance that we are not rushing ahead with a 'quick fit' plan but looking very carefully at every element of what needs to be done to make the church a useful building for now and the foreseeable future.
