Parking

I am continuing to receive complaints regarding parking on the pavement, double yellow lines and grass verges.

Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs, people with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs. Please remember the pavement is for pedestrians and not vehicles.

Reporting incidents

After speaking to local residents, I have been made aware of incidents that have happened but have not been reported to police. It is very important that if you witness any incident or see anything suspicious to report it to police. If you do not report it then police will not be aware that it is happening. With this in mind, you should call 101 to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency response

You should always call 999 when it is an emergency, such as when a crime is in progress, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.

What about nuisance or environmental issues?

You should continue to contact your local council about general issues in your area such as:

- •Dog fouling
- Abandoned vehicles
- •Dumping and fly tipping
- •Vandalism of public property

Nature Notes

On a walk in the Chilterns we passed the Alpaca farm where we had stopped previously. A large flock of animals were gathered around a gate and we couldn't resist going to see them. They had just been shorn and the close cut had emphasised the length of their necks. Heads had not been cut so that a mop cap lay between their ears and their legs had also been left uncut which gave them a



comical look. Colours ranged from white to chestnut brown and even one of slate-blue. They pushed and shoved to get close to the gate yet would start back suddenly if any one showed nervousness. They were beautiful animals with their huge eyes and steady gaze and most pristine after their haircuts. A few exceptions to this were some which had sprawled on the ground in the sunshine but generally a 'Persil' bunch. It was a great opportunity for a photo shot so did we have a camera? NO!

After a Winter ashore, the tern raft has been re-launched on the flooded gravel pits which we often visit. Immediately, a pair of terns has nested. Other hopeful terns have been driven away by the new tenants. Local Wildlife Trust members hope to install a second raft encouraged by the success of the first.

We have been aware of how few swallows, martens and swifts are about this Summer. A local, expert naturalist has agreed with our concerns and offered a number of possible reasons-not good news.

A first for us were bullfinches seen feeding on the ground in the garden. Bullfinch chicks are fed caterpillars and the adult diet consists of buds and shoots so it is rare to see them other than in a twiggy habitat.

From Methodist Church Trustee Notes:

Because we were a small village church, we were always known as Kingsclere Chapel. It was founded in December 1812, but according to Kelly's Directory, not dedicated until 1826.

In 1945 the trustees were Messrs F Hardham, A Cooke senior, G Hopkins, H Smith, C Smith, GW Hopkins, H Hopkins, F Hopkins, Mrs A Cooke senior and Mrs FJ Hopkins.

Mr Hardham (brother in law to Mr George Hopkins) was responsible for the fires and there were volunteers to assist with the dusting.

In 1947 Mr & Mrs Haines became caretakers. The flower secretary was Mrs F Hopkins. The same year the insurance was raised to £3,000 on the chapel, and £1,000 on the house.

In 1949 a legacy of £50 was received from the late John Bradfield's estate. Refunds from the Covenant scheme amounted to £65 11 2d. The piano was purchased for £18.

I cannot tell you how much I enjoyed the little Sunday service at Alton Hospital where Jesus Blessing the Children was read from Three Gospels. This really raised my spirits. May God bless those who care!




