

**ROAD CLOSURE – FIREWORKS 9-NOV-2019** – The Friends of Kingsclere School (FKS) has made an application for a road closure and the plan is as per previous years to close Foxs Lane. Parking restrictions will apply in some locations and FKS is seeking to ensure residents are not too disrupted. There will be a written notice posted through homes in a prescribed area in the village. This is a tremendous community event enjoyed by many that raises money for the Primary School. We hope that any localised short-term disruption is minimised but accepted as it allows significant benefit to be generated for the village.

NB – The village fireworks event is managed by a sub-committee of FKS and not by Kingsclere Parish Council. Kingsclere Parish Council thank the volunteers of the Firework Committee for their dedication in running such a fantastic and well organised event for the village.

**ROAD CLOSURE – REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 10-NOV-2019** – The Parish Council will be closing the roads to traffic in the centre of the village again this year for the Remembrance Walk along Swan Street and the Silence at 11am. We respectfully ask motorists to be mindful of this.

**ANNUAL REPORT** – The Annual Report produced by the Parish Council has now been delivered to all homes in Kingsclere. If you have not received yours yet, please contact the Parish Office (contact details above) and we will arrange for one to be sent to you.

**HELP AND SUPPORT ON CHANGES FOLLOWING BREXIT** – Local residents can get help and support on changes that may affect them following Brexit.

Supported by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Citizens Advice Basingstoke and Tadley will be providing a new service to support residents in the borough affected by changes as a result of Brexit.

European citizens living in the UK are required to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 30 June 2021, with an estimated 7,000 people currently living in the borough needing to apply to the scheme.

Other support the charity will provide includes guidance on employment rights and EU employees' rights to stay, UK citizens living overseas and looking to return and consumer concerns such as travel insurance and access to healthcare.

As well as help and support from Citizens Advice, digital assistance is available for residents who do not have the access, skills or confidence to complete the online form by appointment at Viables Community Centre. To arrange an appointment, please call We Are Digital on 03333 445675.

#### **Nature Notes**

A recent holiday, island hopping in Greece, left many memories of sun, sea and scenery but two favourites are both sky related. Firstly, as the day cooled and daylight slipped away it was pleasant to sit and enjoy the gathering darkness. Twilight



is that wonderful time when features in the landscape start to lose their edges before finally becoming indistinct as night arrives: And what night, deep and black and no trace of artificial glow. Secondly, our final hotel was situated high on a hill with an uninterrupted view of sea and horizon and it was entertaining to watch the sun set. Once it had lost its brightness and turned into the familiar orange ball it was easy to follow its path until vanishing below the horizon. It was easy to imagine it being swallowed by the sea. The time from first wetting its toes to disappearing completely was rapid, roughly two and a half minutes and we half expected to hear a loud SIZZLE! A superb sunset followed.

In an open sided dining area swallow's nests (empty) were still in place and were prominent due to the local mud used, a red ochre.

The lawns at the front of two houses are peppered with tiny mounds of soil, all well spaced and each with an entrance hole on top. Very small bees are seen going in and out all day, these are mining bees, one of 65 species that are ground nesters. The young emerge in May having fed as grubs on nectar and pollen provided in their underground cells when the eggs were laid. While it is common to see this activity along flower border edges such a mass concentration is new to us but it is a good excuse to delay mowing for a while.

Don't you love the M25?! I recently had the pleasure of spending much too much time sailing up and down it as I went to a course at a church in Sevenoaks, Kent. I offered to drive a friend and he used the navigation on his phone. We were cutting it fine time-wise but were on course to just make the start with 10mins to spare. But at the crucial moment, as we were about to leave the M25, my friend got a phone call and I took the wrong junction. All was not lost as that only added 7mins, the time up to the next junction & back, so we were hopeful of still getting there at a reasonable time. But as we approached that fateful junction, I, being nosy and listening to my friend's phone call, got distracted and ended up back on the M25 but this time heading back home! That added 20 mins. We were going to be very late, an incredibly frustrating experience made worse by the fact that it was totally my fault. It reminds me of the time I was driving to Chepstow when we lived in Wales and I missed the junction and ended up having to go across the bridge and return on it, and most annoyingly having to pay the toll!!

Anyway, the reason I share such a story is not warn you of my awful navigation but to illustrate how easy it is to get distracted, and not just on the road. Life is full of distractions but one of the things that strikes me as I look at the life of Jesus is that He is focused; He knows His purpose; He doesn't get distracted. And He can give clarity, direction and a purpose to each of our lives too. His purpose was to give His life so that we could come to know Him and live life to the full. And He is not just some divine finger pointer, remote and detached, but He is also the Companion on the journey, the Supporter who urges us on, and the Friend who keeps us going.

As the days continue to draw in and the chill of winter begins to set in, don't settle for life as it's always been, but call on Jesus for life as it's always meant to be.
