#### Kingsclere Primary School

Please may I once again remind parents who are picking up children from Kingsclere Primary School to be considerate when parking in Priors Close. Your should avoid blocking driveways or parking too close to the junctions, which might cause an accident. With regard to Ashford Hill Primary School, parents are asked to park in the church carpark a short distance away; it is the designated car park for the school.

#### Parking in George St

I am receiving more complaints about vehicles parking on the pavement

and on double yellow lines, especially along George Street, Kingsclere. Parking on the pavement can seriously inconvenience pedestrians, wheelchair users, people with visual impairment and those with prams or pushchairs. Please remember the pavement is for pedestrians and not vehicles.

#### **Reporting incidents**

After speaking to local residents I have been made aware of incidents that have not been reported. It is very important that if you witness an incident or see anything suspicious, you must report it to the police. Normally, you should dial 101 if a crime has already been committed, or you have another concern that does not require an emergency response. For example, if:

Your car has been stolen

Your property has been damaged

You suspect drug use or dealing in your neighbourhood

You are aware of anti-social behaviour

However, you should always call 999 when it is an emergency, such as when a crime is in progress, or someone suspected of a crime is nearby, or when there is danger to life, or violence is being used or threatened. What about nuisance or environmental issues? You should continue to contact your local council about issues in your area such as:

- Dog fouling
- Abandoned vehicles
- Dumping and fly-tipping
- Vandalism to public property

Finally, please feel free to email me if you have any concerns, or would just like some advice. However, you should immediately report any incidents by phoning 101 or 999. While I am happy to take reports via email, please note that I work shifts and may be on rest-days or leave, and not receive your email for a few days.

#### Nature Notes

The first lambs we saw this year were triplets and so newborn that the first of them was only just standing, Number 2 lay on the grass somewhat amazed at the world around it, and Number 3 was being efficiently licked into life by the very capable mother. Lambs demonstrate such energy and fun as they do vertical take-off jumps and dash madly round each other.



The season features greatly in our notes this month. The cool morning had given way to gentle warmth as we walked down a hilly path of a field in where ewes were watching their lambs. The ewes were lying down and gently chewing cud, but the lambs had gone a stage further. They were sprawled flat on the cool grass with their legs out in front of them and soaking up every drop of sunshine: Winter had passed and Spring arrived! At The Vyne recently there was a small group of people staring intently at a sunny bank on which there was a tangle of brushwood. We joined them and at first saw nothing unusual, but then, as our eyes grew accustomed to the brightness, we became aware of movement - grass snakes. They were juveniles and emerging from within the woodpile and into the spring sun-

shine.

A pair of robins using a nest-box in the garden, have enjoyed a supply of mealworms from a hanging feeder. Two different habits evolved in feeding the chicks. Sometimes one bird would fly straight from feeder to nest, at other times a number of short flights from one perch to another finally ended at the nest. On one occasion fourteen diversions occurred. As both parents are identical it was impossible to know if each bird followed a different habit.

# The Church Pages

#### Reflections



11

This month sees the beginning of our new weekly services at <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>. St. Mary's church, Kingsclere. Meeting in the Kingsmill

Room at 8:45 a.m. for breakfast and then 9:15 in church for the service, we hope these services will enable us to worship God and equip us to live as people who are committed to Jesus. The theme of the first term of these services is Following Jesus: big shoes to fill. You may have seen the banner or even seen the shoes! The idea is that, as Christians, we are meant to be followers of Jesus and that his example is one which is very challenging. He asks us to be like Him and His shoes are difficult to fill.

This has been brought home to me very clearly as I write in the middle of holy week, which is when we remember Jesus' last week before his death and resurrection. Hearing about Jesus in that week 2000 or so years ago inspires but also disheartens me. I'm inspired by the courageous Jesus who, knowing what awaited Him in Jerusalem, entered the city on the back of a donkey, and yet I'm disheartened because so often I lack the courage even to mention His name. I'm inspired by the humble Jesus, who washed his disciples' feet the night before He died, including the feet of his betrayer, Judas, and yet I'm disheartened that, more often than not, I want to be served and not to serve. I'm inspired by the obedient Jesus who went through all the mocking, torture and humiliation because it was what He was called to do, and yet I'm disheartened that most of the time I want to do my own thing. I'm inspired by the forgiving Jesus who said "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do" as He was crucified, and yet disheartened that I hold many things against many people. I could go on. If we are called to follow Jesus, it seems impossible.

However, I know God does not want to dishearten us. In one sense, following Jesus is an impossible task but in another, it is possible if we continually ask for his Spirit to empower us. I hope and pray that these new services might help us to receive His Spirit and be enabled to be true followers of Jesus.



Busy Bees have applied for a Local Infrastructure Grant to make some urgent improvements to The Scout Hut. We have reached the second round and have a good case. # The Rec

The Dell Recreation Ground, to use it's proper name, or "the Park" as some people call it has belonged to the people of Kingsclere since 1845.

Kingsclere was one of the last parishes in Hampshire to retain open fields which are not a particularly efficient agriculture. In 1843 there were still 2000 acres mainly concentrated in the valley where the stables are and including Dell Hill. That year an act for General Enclosure for Kingsclere was passed and the Parliamentary Commissioners supervised the break up of the open fields into smaller ones enclosed by hedges. This was done by 1845.

Above the Dell a piece of land was allocated to the residents as The Pleasure Ground. It was held in trust for the people and when the Parish Council was formed in 1894 the members became the trustees of the charity, which they still are today.

Originally it was maintained by sheep grazing but it was later maintained by the farmer at Brimley Hill Farm who managed it as a hay meadow. The top of the ridge was levelled in the 1960s to create a football pitch for the Saturday and Sunday Teams leaving the southern part as a meadow. It was no longer required for hay so the trustees decided to manage it as a wildflower meadow. This means cutting it once or twice a year and carting away the cut vegetation. The meadow is rich in plants and especially cowslips, pyramid orchids, yellow rattle and knapweed broomrape.

In the 1970s it was designated as a village green which protects it as a public open space. Traces of the old open field plots can still be seen.

# Kingsclere Youth...could more facilities be provided?

Can our community do more to nurture the excellent potential of youthful energy?

Some incidents of anti-social behaviour have occurred recently. I write to suggest renewed debate as a route to urgent planning and action. We are rightly proud of the many clubs and activities already provided for our young people but they deserves the widest possible publicity, over and above the current use of social media. Increased advertising in The Tower and perhaps contributions to Newbury Weekly News would be useful.

Insurance paid after the Youth Club fire of 2005 amounted to £140,000. It still seems to be available. Those who could benefit from it ought to help the Trustees find affordable ways of spending it. Ideas such as a 'Youth Shelter', a special room at the Fieldgate centre and an all-weather rink for scooters have so far not materialised. (Some were too costly). We need an urgent start to enable our youngsters to feel valued and their needs addressed. Perhaps a 'Teens' Facilities Focus Group' could be set up to work with the Youth Club Trustees on projects for the near future. Who is the teenager who could represent their ideas? It would only need one interested family to set the ball rolling!

The future belongs to our young people. Let us create a new mechanism to enable them to make more positive contributions to their own lives the life of our village. I do not foresee a future role for myself in this but Pat O'Leary has kindly offered to help me coordinate any immediate suggestions or offers. I also suggest further discussion through next month's Tower please.

Our local police need information to help them look after the welfare of Kingsclere. You can reach them easily through 101. Please do not hesitate to call them about any incident of an anti-social nature or other information to help them help us.
