

KINGSCLERE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

At the time of writing I've just returned from a 3½ hour meeting with other members of the group where we agreed the selection criteria for selecting sites for future development. We then started on the selection process itself but time got the better of us so the task will resume at our next group meeting. When scoring sites we are referring to all the evidence we have amassed over the last few years – developer's proposals, landscape assessments, environmental & archaeological designations, physical constraints etc. It is proving to be a slow task but we are committed to making sound evidence based decisions on this important issue. In the meantime, members of the group will be meeting with officers from both planning and landscape departments at Basingstoke & Deane to make sure our proposals do not conflict with the Borough's strategic policies.

We have also been putting the finishing touches to a range of polices/ projects on such issues as building design, housing densities, affordable housing, parking, trees, open spaces etc.etc. Further grant funding has been applied for to cover the cost of the Strategic Environmental Assessment we are required to undertake plus further consultancy assistance.

Friday 17th October has been chosen for our next public meeting (venue to be confirmed but hopefully at the Fieldgate Centre) when we should be in a position to put our proposals to the village prior to going out to formal consultation. Please note your diaries – this will be an important meeting affecting the future of the village for the next 15 years.

House Burglary - This month we have had no burglaries from houses.

Incidents of note

13/06/15- 14/06/15- Between the hours of 7PM on the 13th June and 9AM on the 14th June, access was gained to a business premise in Ashford Hill. A VW golf had the rear window smashed and the jack from inside the car was removed and used to take all four wheels from the vehicle. An Audi TT was also entered but no damage has been observed.

22/06/15- At approximately 00:55 offenders have attempted to gain entry to an ATM at the Budgens garage on the A339. The offenders were not successful and were disturbed by our patrol car. They did drive across farmers land between Union lane and the A339 to gain access to the ATM. Crops were also damaged in the process.

23/06/15- 23:50- Offenders have forced entry into the front of the same garage as the incident described above and tried to steal from the cigarette counter, but failed to do so. The garage does now have a permanent 24 hour security man.

We have had reports of Anti Social Behaviour in and around the Long-croft Road and South Road area of Kingsclere. Local officers will be attending these areas as part of their regular patrol. The young persons involved are between the ages of 8 and 16 years old.

SPEEDWATCH REPORT JULY 2015

Due to the holiday session approaching we have limited results for June, however we feel our effort since the start of the exercise has been worth everyone's dedication.


Speedwatch has been operating in the village for 6 months now. You may have seen our volunteers operating with their Speed Indicating Device. Volunteers record the speed and details of vehicles travelling at substantially above the speed limit and this information is sent to the Police who send out warning letters to the vehicle registered keeper. No prosecutions result from our activities, however for persistent or particularly fast offenders a home visit from the Police can be expected.

Our activities have shown that there a number of drivers who travel through the village at particularly anti-social speeds for which there can be no excuse. One of these drivers was found travelling at 62mph and then again the next week at 57mph on the Basingstoke Road.

The weather in June/July has been very hot and there is promise of more to come so make sure that your cat has somewhere cool and shady to rest and a constant supply of clean drinking water. Our cats have been rather off their food and wet food, if left for any length of time, ends up crawling with maggots. If not eaten within half an hour it is best taken away. A supply of dry biscuits should keep him happy until the next meal.

Nature Notes

If you wish to find an escape from madding crowds, traffic, noise and litter and are in the North

Devon area then try a trip to Lundy Island. This is a gem of a place set out in the Bristol Channel approximately two hours by ferry, it measures 3x1/2 miles. It is surprisingly high but once the climb from the jetty has been done walking along cliff paths is reasonable and the views all around, superb. The emphasis is on the Environment both maritime and island and there are lots to interest naturalist or walker alike. We enjoyed blue sea, blue sky and SILENCE.

Many moorland pools on Dartmoor were alive with tadpoles many of which were just beginning to show leg growth, very late compared with our own area. The acid nature of the water means limited plant life and the lack of nourishment delays growth.

Part of our Tower delivery round takes us to some outlying properties reached by a long grassy track bounded by fields. In late June we spotted what we thought initially was a muntjac on the grass verge. As we approached very slowly a tiny roe fawn wobbled into view. What a lovely sight-big ears, a slightly rough red coat and clearly very young. It slipped through the hedge and our final view was as it made its way through the long grass, hopefully to find its mother. Roe fawns are usually hidden in deep cover while the doe feeds and returns to suckle it at intervals.

It was encouraging to see house martin nests built in good numbers in the eaves of an old property locally. Modern building techniques and materials are partly responsible for a drop in nest sites.





And now a man whose surname was Rose: I've never heard his first name as he was known to all the village as Sixty. His brother-in-law Ted Hutchins told me this yarn about him. Sixty pints a week was his normal dose; eight each working day and ten pints at the weekend. One night in the Swan Sixty was told if he could drink a gallon of beer in a quarter of an hour, there would be a free gallon for him. "I shall have to think about that" says Sixty, so he pops along the street to the Crown and finds he can manage 8 pints quite easily in 15 minutes. Back he goes to the Swan, accepts the challenge and drinks another 8 pints in 15 minutes, and wins for himself another 8 pints.

Some years later, Mr. Hopkins the builder sends Sixty down to me to connect my cottages to the main sewer, and it seems he had gone completely over to tea drinking.

Dear Editors

What a joy it was when I saw this copy of the 50th anniversary Tower. It must have been a difficult task for those who decided which items to include and which to leave out. How fortunate for us readers to have someone who has kept these writings all these years.

I am shown disapproval because I am a hoarder. There are copies of those magazines which I cannot throw out for recycling which include articles on Kingsclere such as Guyon Bull's 'The Story of Kingsclere' with the map of 1752 showing the buildings in George Street with the Black Horse Inn, Duck Street, the workhouse next to the Golden Falcon in what is now the churchyard. The Title Barn and stew pond in what is now the school playing field.

In 1986 Joan (nee Mortimer) Constantine wrote her memories on Kingsclere in the tower. She wrote 50 years earlier (1936) the Village Club was the centre of activity with billiards, snooker, table tennis and darts. She recalled that Ron Pearce had a lovely touch on the piano, while his brother Algy and Bill Edwards both had lovely tenor voices, ideal for singing in the Choral Society which also met at the Village Club.

Bim Payne and Jerry Theobald went to the Albert Hall in Swan Street dressed as Zulus. "Their bodies covered in zebra grate polish and they looked fantastic in their grass skirts."

It is good to know the first page from the Kingsclere Tower was written by the vicar Rev. David Shearlock. I was somewhat surprised when Gordon came home from Church and said they had been told to call him David. To me, vicars and doctors were always called by their surnames otherwise it showed a lack of respect. How things have changed, but have they gone a little too far when children call pensioners by their Christian names? At least they still call their teachers by Miss, Mrs. or Mr. showing respect.

Kingsclere puts on best show of the season

This article originally appeared in the Newbury Weekly News on August 24th 1905.

The best show held this season in the Newbury district. This crystallises the general opinion of the visitors to the annual show held under the auspices of the Kingsclere Horticultural Society.

The show has prospered much during the last sixteen years in no small measure due to the organisational ability of Doctor Maples who, although he has resigned the post of hon. secretary still retains the greatest interest in the Society as was shown by the fact that he once again placed the commodious and convenient grounds at the rear of Tower Hill House[1] at the disposal of the executive.

During some recent seasons the Society has been rather unfortunate in regard to the weather and the balance at the bank has become somewhat depleted. But the exchequer should be appreciably assisted as a result of yesterday's show for although the morning did not look over promising, the clouds cleared away as the day wore on, and with the sun shining brilliantly in the afternoon, the people came up in large numbers.

The gate receipts totalled about £65[2] which considering the fact that three other shows were taking place yesterday and Kingsclere is off[3] railway speaks volumes for the popularity of the exhibition.

There were nearly 1000 entries in yesterday's show and the excellent quality of the exhibits showed no trace of the trying season which horticulturists have had to combat with in very adverse circumstances. They were capitally staged in three large marquees[4] and arranged in a most satisfactory manner giving plenty of room to the exhibits as well as the spectators.

The show falls at the time of year when the ordinary exhibitor is able to exhibit of his best, and the area covered by the Society is a wide one including Kingsclere, Woodlands, Headley, Ecchinswell, Sydmonton, Hannington, Ewhurst, Wolverton, Baughurst and Tadley.[5] The prize list Is larger than that offered by any other society in the locality.

The competition is keen in all classes, professional, amateur, arrtisan and labourers. Where the show is so much in advance of others in the neighbourhood is in regard to the floral exhibits. These help to make the exhibition so much more attractive.
