CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING -Any real trees that need recycling after the celebration can be done so at The Fieldgate Centre from Wednesday 2 January until Sunday 27 January 2019.

FESTIVE BIN COLLECTIONS - Christmas can mean extra rubbish. Therefore, extra sacks will be collected on the first collection after Christmas ONLY. As normal there is no limit on how much residents can recycle.

• Flatten large cardboard boxes and leave them next to your recycling bin.

• Wrapping paper cannot be recycled so please put it in your black waste bin.

The collections days for your black (general waste) bins are Friday 28 December; Friday 4 January; Thursday 10 January. Unless adverse weather affects bin rounds, collections should return to normal from Monday 14th January.


It was a glorious day and a small group of volunteers set about where a small group of volunteers set about clearing the undergrowth on the footpaths around

Nature Notes

This has been a bumper year for beech mast and acorns and drifts of both have been regularly crunched underfoot. Acorns are known to be toxic to horses but enjoyed by pigs. On a walk in the Newtown Common area we were surprised to see sheep eagerly foraging in the long grass for acorns and



munching them noisily. Knowing that sheep are nibblers of short grass, seeing them enjoying the hard shelled nuts was a revelation. The annual custom of pannage occurs when pigs are released into woods to fatten on acorns and is still practised in the New Forest today.

The morning was misty with an autumn sun just showing and making distant trees on the fringe of the Common indistinct. The mist appeared to be particularly thick low down, covering bush and other vegetation alike. As the sun broke through the carpet of mist sparkled as hundreds upon hundreds of cobwebs were suddenly revealed by the angle of the sun and heaviness of the dew.

In a narrow lane a large pine tree at the gate of a house had been felled which had left a stump several metres high. This has been skilfully transformed into a wonderful carving of a pine cone. Sculpturing with chain saws has really advanced.

On the same walk we passed an area where variegated bamboo has escaped from a garden and is romping across the footpath and into the adjacent woodland. It is hard to eradicate once it is established and swamps all woodland plants.


St Mary's 'Staycation' 31st January
