Kingsclere Neighbourhood Plan

Good news – we have been awarded a grant of £8k to cover the cost of the Strategic Environmental Assessment we are required to undertake for our plan. We are hoping our consultants, AECOM, will be able to commence work on this important document by the end of the month.

Our group of volunteers have met twice now to assess the evidence and select sites we will recommend for future development. The task is proving longer than we anticipated, generating a good deal of discussion between the group. After 5 hours we are only half way through so we are having an additional meeting, mid August, to complete the task. We will publish our conclusions and the criteria we have applied once we have finished the job in good time for our public meeting, where we will discuss our recommendations with residents along with a range of policies/projects on such issues as building design, housing densities, affordable housing, parking, trees, open spaces etc. Please be patient with us – at the time of writing, 4th August, many of the group are off on their holidays so there will be delays in posting documents on the web.

Please note your diaries – our public meeting will be held on Friday 16th October at the Fieldgate Centre, commencing 7.30pm.

Nature Notes

On our last two walks we have seen destruction of wasps' nests by badgers in their search for the juicy grubs. In each case the nest had been built into an earth bank and Brock had used its powerful claws to rip aside the protective soil to get at the paper nest beneath, gouge marks clearly visible in the clay. One nest had partially survived and workers were carrying out damage limitation but the other had been totally exposed and abandoned, the few young wasps remaining crawling aimlessly about. It is unlikely that the wasps allowed the destruction to occur without a fight but badgers are quite well protected and very determined feeders.



A shallow stone bird bath 16" across has become a source of interest this summer. Honey bees from a local hive arrive to drink, sometimes sixty plus at a time and line up shoulder to shoulder around the edge. A bit of jostling goes on and one is reminded, on a minute scale, of wildebeest at a Serengeti waterhole. Occasionally an individual falls in or is blown in by a gust of wind. Landing face down enables them to "row" with the wings to the edge, landing belly up is fatal but when offered a finger or a twig the casualty quickly latches on and after a brief grooming, flies off. They are gentle and mannerly. One bee was so exhausted that it was offered a tiny drop of maple syrup, welcome fuel it seemed as it was eagerly lapped up. Wasps are altogether different and are arriving more frequently in early August. They are aggressive hunters, approaching each bee in the hope of finding a weakling as prey, fortunately the wasps are outnumbered. Topping up the water daily highlights how much water bees carry back to their colony.

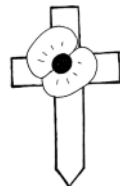

LEST WE FORGET

10 August 1915 - Two Kingsclere Men Killed at Gallipoli

Privates F Dunmall and F Seymour of the 10th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment are listed by the War Graves Commission as having lost their lives at Gallipoli on the same day.



The 10th battalion had landed at Suvla Bay on the night of 9 August as part of an attempt to break the deadlock which had set in at the Cape Helles battlefield. The aim was to land a division at the undefended Suvla Bay and to capture the heights above, cutting off the Turkish Army opposing the original landing. The assault was badly led and bogged down with heavy losses, failing completely to achieve its objective.

The two men were initially posted as missing so little is known as to exactly how or when they died [there was a massive Turkish counter attack on the 10th August]. As a result Seymour's mother was convinced that he would return home. Consequently she refused permission for him to be recorded on the Kingsclere War Memorial.

His name does appear on the Kingsclere Roll of Honour at the Village Club where he is shown as dead. Both men are recorded on the Gallipoli War Memorial on the tip of Cape Helles.

Kingsclere Rec – a very special meeting place

If you walk your dog or play football on Kingsclere's recreation ground above Swan Street, you probably have no idea what extremely important activity is going on above your head on warm spring and summer afternoons.

It's a secret honeybee mating place. The male bees (drones) gather there in the hope of finding a queen bee on her mating flight.

The mating sites may persist for years and even centuries. Strangely bee scientists cannot identify exactly what makes a good mating site, but obviously the bees can!

So, Kingsclere Recreation Ground is a very special place. If you see quite big bees flying around in groups of ten or twenty about three or four metres off the ground, they are probably chasing a queen. Don't worry, they won't sting you – drones don't even have a sting.

I know about the mating site because I'm a local beekeeper and decided to find out where my bees were mating by going out with a long fishing pole with a queen pheromone (scent) lure on the end of it. Yes, it does look rather odd! I tell people I am going fly-fishing for drones. I've had more than 50 drones chasing the lure on Kingsclere Rec.

Be thankful for these honeybees. The worker bees are pollinating your fruit and vegetables. Without them your diet would be very boring. And what is more delicious than their honey? You can buy local honey made by my bees in Swan Street Stores and The Village Butcher.

Twenty Nine Years of Kingsclere History- Gift To The Village Archives

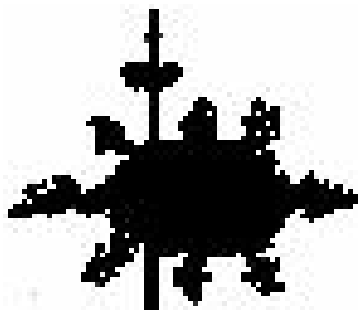
