We sorely miss Fiona whose association with Kingsclere Parish Council stretches back at least 25 years, serving first as a parish Councillor under the chairmanship of the late Elizabeth Kay and Peter Woodman in the 1990s. She then came off the Council and worked with Sheila Thompson as Assistant Clerk, only to return in 2016 to serve a further five and a half years as a Parish Councillor.

We have greatly valued her experience and wise counsel in meetings and her hard work on the Planning and Personnel Panels, and her organisational skills on events, such as the Making a Difference Awards. We all have come to rely on her proof-reading skills and her clarity with the written word. Add to this her work as a Village Club Trustee, Secretary of Kingsclere Film Club, her volunteering with the Community Library and Victim Support and, for a while, as a school governor, we have in Fiona a significant record of voluntary public service. NEW COUNCILLOR GRANT SCHEME LAUNCHED TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY PROJECTS -Community groups and organisations can now apply for funding support for small-scale items to support local groups and projects following the launch of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's new Councillor Community Grant Scheme.

Grants of between £250 and £1,000 are available to help groups and not for profit organisations purchase equipment which will make a difference to people's lives and help bring communities together following the COVID-19 pandemic. Each councillor across Basingstoke and Deane will have a £2,000 pot to support projects in their communities until 31st March 2022. The maximum grant that will be available for each project in a ward is £1,000. Funding is available for voluntary groups, charities, schools, faith groups and town and parish councils for projects which meet the scheme criteria. THE CEMETERY– a polite reminder regarding dogs in the Cemetery. FESTIVE BIN COLLECTIONS – Christmas can mean extra rubbish. Therefore, extra sacks will be collected on the first collection after Christmas ONLY. As normal there is no limit on how much residents can recycle. For more information on what can be recycled visit: www.basingstoke.gov.uk/recycling

- Flatten large cardboard boxes and leave them next to your recycling bin.
- Wrapping paper cannot be recycled so please put it in your black waste bin. You can take your real Christmas tree along to one of BDBC's tree recycling drop-off points from Monday 3rd January to Sunday 30th January 2022. Garden Waste service customers can put their trees out with garden waste. Last year thousands of your trees were transformed into soil conditioner for gardens and wood chippings for parks. Visit www.basingstoke.gov.uk/christmas-tree to find your nearest drop off point.

Unless bad weather affects bin rounds, there will be NO change to collection days over the festive break this year as Christmas Day and Boxing Day fall at the weekend and BDBC will collect on the bank holidays. Put out your grey bin on your usual day before 7am, together with your green bin on your normal recycling week. See collection dates further below.

Christmas and New Year

We would like to take this opportunity of thanking our patients for their kind words and support that we have been given during what has been for all our Team another very challenging year. Covid sadly still exists and we need to continue to observe a number of requirements to keep our surgeries safe for patients and our Team. On behalf of our Partners and Team, we wish everyone a restful and safe Christmas and New Year season.

Please check your stock of Repeat medications in good time, especially if you are going away over Christmas, as we do need up to 5 working days notice to fully process a repeat prescription safely.

Covid Vaccination Programme

We are now working through the Cohorts from highest risk down for Covid Boosters. The Covid Booster can only be given 6 months after the 2nd vaccination; should the policy change we will contact patients as quickly as possible. All patients who are immunosuppressed and eligible for a 3rd Covid vaccination have now been offered a booster.

Any new patients joining our practice and who have not had a first or second Covid vaccination elsewhere can still get a vaccination.

Flu Clinics

Please note that all patients over 65 will be able to have their Flu vaccine and Covid Booster at the same time through Jameson House in Basingstoke. Patients who do not wish to have a Flu and Covid booster at the same time can have their Covid Booster at Jameson House and then will need to book their flu vaccination with one of the wide range of Pharmacies also able to offer Flu vaccinations.

Under 65 clinics for patients with Underlying Health Conditions will be offered at Kingsclere or Overton. We will contact patients as vaccine supplies become available.

Child Flu Clinics

We are working through contacting the parents of eligible children who are aged 2 – 3 or aged 4 – 17 if they have a condition which puts them at greater risk if they get flu. Any patients who have eligible children who have not yet been given a date for an appointment, please give us a call. Children in years R-7 will be vaccinated in school by Schools Health.


The Kingsclere Singers are excited to be back this year and are fa la la-ing all the way this Christmas with their annual Yule Sing events.

The Church Pages



“The news was life-altering. My parents had been in a terrible car accident in South Africa... My mother had been killed along with two colleagues and friends... and my father was in a critical condition.”

J. Swinney, *The Whole Christmas Story* (Abingdon: 2021), p.13

So writes the author of our Advent book this year, who was only just beginning to write when she lost her mum. She speaks in the introduction of her immense pain and grief, and the comfort and strength that her faith brought. She also shares of her family's struggle to celebrate Christmas without her mum, who so loved it.

I wonder how Christmas will be for you this year. Are you anticipating large family gatherings, days of festivities and parties, making up for the very limited celebrations of 2020? Are you hoping to revive some of those traditions that were stifled by Covid? Or are you worried about how it might play out?

Christmas for all of us, I guess, will have been impacted – for some the loss of someone dear will mean it will never be the same. If that's you, I'd love to invite you to our Remembering at Christmas service this Sunday, 5th December at 4pm at St. Mary's Church, Kingsclere. This service offers an opportunity to remember a loved one through lighting a candle and acknowledges something of the pain of grief that is especially felt around Christmas.

I guess for many of us the pandemic has changed our perspective on things, possibly even on what we believe. Perhaps we're no longer content with the superficial answers given by the media or prevailing culture. If so, I'd encourage you to read *The Whole Christmas Story*. It is designed to take you on a journey day by day to understand how Christmas fits into the big picture of the Christian story. Each day there are about 3 pages to read concluding with some direction for reflection and a prayer if you would like to use it. It would also be ideal for someone who too often finds the rush and busyness of the festive season crowd out what it's really all about. If you'd like a copy, please let me know and I'll happily get one to you.

Whatever anticipations or preparations you are making this year, I hope and pray you have a peaceful, fulfilling Christmas and New Year.

Private Prayer & Mid-Week Service


St Mary's Church will be open each Thursday between 10am and 1pm for those that wish to use it for private prayer or quiet reflection.

December In The Garden

We may get a few mild days in December, but mostly the weather is cold, frosty, and we often get bitter winds. The better days enable us to tidy up the garden, picking up the remaining leaves. The frost hopefully will kill a few of bugs and break up the soil in the vegetable garden that has been dug over. While tidying up the garden, don't forget to leave a few safe Havens for the creatures that hibernate in the winter.

Fences, sheds, and wooden raised vegetable beds will need protection from winter weather. These days there is a good choice of wood preservatives that are not harmful to plants, particularly if you have climbing plants on wooden fences or frames.

Cleaning moss from paths is a must, as this time of year they can become treacherous. Using a solution of household bleach will do the job, taking care to keep it away from plants. Leave for a few minutes, then scrub away the moss.

Pruning may still be done on tall bush roses to prevent the wind from rocking them, also any overgrown hedges can be cut back. Ornamental vines will need pruning to keep under control and prevent overcrowding. If you own a pot grown bay tree, this will need protection from cold weather. Move it to a sheltered part of the garden or greenhouse as the leaves do not enjoy cold weather.

December is the latest that Tulips can be planted. You may be able to find some bargains as stockists will be wanting to get rid of any bulbs they have left. Remember to make sure bulbs are still firm and do not have any mould.

Brassicas may need canes to give support otherwise the wind can blow them over. Remove yellow leaves as they can encourage disease.

I have just planted winter sowing broad beans, these seem to do rather well in our garden, and the shallots that I planted a few weeks ago are growing well, no doubt it's the mild weather we have had this Autumn.

Prune blackcurrants now as they fruit on new and old wood, and remove one third of the bush to maintain vigour.

The amaryllis bulbs are available now, and make spectacular houseplants. Do not plant deeply when putting them into the pot. If you have the patience and the space to keep them after flowering, they will flower again the following year. The secret is to let them dry out for a short period, timing is important.

We can still enjoy winter flowering shrubs, the winter box is budding up ready to give a wonderful scent in the garden, as will the mahonia and viburnum, and if the weather permits the odd rose can often perform up until Christmas.

Nature Notes

What is wrong with the berries? Both pyracantha and cotoneaster have been loaded with juicy fruit and would usually by now have been picked clean but much of it remains. Blackbirds are always the first to stake acclaim but have chosen to stay away. Is there such an abundance of natural food this year that they do not need to brave the prickles or fewer birds? Send for the heavy brigade, the ever-dependable wood pigeon. They have taken to sitting on the pyracantha hedge and systematically grazing the area within their reach then moving on, the result being the upper half is well picked but the lower part remains loaded.

The current spell of fine afternoons has produced some wonderful sunsets and skylines. Coming over the brim of Ashford Hill with its view across the valley, the sky looked huge, a canvas of pure pale blue on which streaks of white, stained with orange from the setting sun had been loosely drawn. A simple scene but very beautiful.

In late October a brightly coloured caterpillar was found in the garden – black and hairy with lines of red and white spots, a ‘touch me not’ warning. October seemed late for caterpillars and two more appeared on a variety of plants; oregano, iris and strawberry. Research proved it to be the larva of the Yellow Tail Moth, a common species but unusual in that it overwinters as a caterpillar and was certainly not feeding on its normal tree-based plants.

Strange little conical pits have appeared in the lawn lately. Having observed families of jackdaws strutting over roadside grassy areas, they are mostly likely to be the cause as they forage in the turf. Their larger cousins the rooks are useful in digging out leatherjacket grubs which damage grass. The grubs emerge as crane flies or daddy longlegs of which we have seen few this year.

In October we mentioned our predecessor Betty Shaw; coincidentally a booklet of a year of her writing has come to hand, marvellously lyrical and descriptive and a joy to read.
