CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING – Although we may not even have the Christmas tree up when this goes to press, any real trees that need recycling after the celebration can be done so at The Fieldgate Centre from Wednesday 3rd January until Sunday 28th January 2018.

FESTIVE BIN COLLECTIONS – Christmas can mean extra rubbish, for example wrapping paper can't be recycled. Therefore, extra sacks will be collected in the first collection after Christmas. As normal there will be no limit on how much residents can recycle.

The collection days for your black (general waste) bins will be Friday 29th December 2017 (instead of Wednesday 27th), Friday 5th January 2018 (instead of Wednesday 3rd) and Thursday 11th January 2018 (instead of Wednesday 10th).

Unless adverse weather affects bin rounds, collections should return to normal from Monday 15th January 2018.

GREEN WHEELY BINS & GLASS RECYCLING – the collections dates are 6th and 20th December 2017, 5th January (Friday) and 17th January 2018.

St Mary's Building Update



There is a lot of refurbishment going on at St Mary's over the coming months to maintain the church as the spiritual and social centre of the village, as well as being a Kingsclere landmark. We need to make sure that it is fit for purpose for the 21C and to pass on to future generations.

The building needs to be dryer, safer and easier to use. Replacing damaged stone work, preventing tile damage, repairs to some roofs and the stair turret and rewiring and installing new lighting in the whole building are some of the our projects. Coming up through January is major work to the Kingsmill Room and after that, redecoration of the main church.

The cost since 2013 has been c £139,000 and another £93,000 is budgeted for the Kingsmill Room and total cost of redecoration. The huge commitment from the congregation and village has provided £108,000, with wonderful support from Friends of St. May's (£67,000), and local grants from Councils and trusts and a VAT refund making up the balance.

Our thanks to you all. Please continue to pray for and support all our work.

Reflections



How could she? He was getting angrier and angrier. As a flurry of abusive, crude insults went through his head, so too came the self-justifying thoughts, “After all I’ve done for her, all we’ve been through, to think that while I was slaving to build our future, she was throwing it all away.” As his rage grew, he smashed down his hand upon his day’s work rendering it useless and in the process, sustaining a nasty graze and splinters. As he tended his wounds, annoyed with himself for losing control, he remembered the lesson his parents had taught him both in word and action. They used to tell him, “Son, when you’re angry, take it to God rather than take it out on anything else – remember you’re in the royal line of David”. This meant little to him until one day in his youth, returning from prayers with his father, he saw him humiliated by a Roman soldier. On their return home, his father, quivering with rage, went straight to the workshop and furiously recited some of David’s psalms at the top of his voice! Now he, his son, finding himself in that same workshop, began to do the same. He shouted and screamed until his voice could take it no more, and exhausted, he slumped into a heap, quietly sobbing and whispering, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” Then he slept, and as he did so, he had the most vivid dream of his life so far, “Joseph, son of David, do not fear...”

Joseph must have been really hurt by what had happened. Had he been asked “What hurts the most?”, he may well have said that it was being betrayed by Mary, his fiancée and one who he deeply trusted, that was until he had that dream. When almost twelve thousand people answered the same question just under a fifth (17%) said that relationship problems were what hurt the most. At Christmas time, we remember an ordinary young couple beginning a family and facing all the challenges that brought. But we also remember an extraordinary God who doesn’t leave them to their own devices but experiences it all first hand in their Son – God’s Son, Jesus Christ.

I look forward to seeing some of you over the Christmas period at our services and do hope you all have a happy Christmas and a blessed New Year.

Police November update



By the time you get to read this article no doubt your Christmas preparations are well underway, buying presents, bulk food shopping, the works Christmas do etc, however criminals, burglars in particular see this as an easy pickings time of the year, please don't become a victim this Christmas, follow these preventative measures to reduce the risk of your Christmas being ruined.

Buy a light timer if you're planning on going away

Let a neighbour you trust know that you are going away and when you be back

Don't leave presents on display in the house or in your car! (You would be amazed how many people leave Christmas presents in the car)

If you're going away for a period of time you can drop me an email, obviously I can't keep an eye on your property 24/7 but I can certainly bear it in mind and keep my eye out. Martyn.evans.25569@hampshire.pnn.police.uk (I work a lot of late shifts)

Other crimes we typically see increase this time of the year is drink driving, I cannot emphasise enough how dangerous this practice is. My colleagues and I at Tadley will be supporting Operation Holly which is Hampshire Police's response to proactively targeting these criminals. I will report back to you after Christmas the results of this.

If you know or suspect someone is drink driving please call us straight away on 999 you could be saving a life.

In terms of criminal activity in the Kingsclere area since my last report I regret to inform you that we have had three recorded dwelling burglaries. During one of these burglaries a vehicle was stolen with keys. The vehicle was sighted by Police in Wiltshire a few days later where it was pursued however the driver decamped from the vehicle and made good an escape.

We have had six non dwelling burglaries also, targeting both sheds and agricultural locations in the area.

I have also had reason to deal with some individuals who have been causing nuisance and annoyance to local businesses on Swan Street this will have hopefully addressed these issues.

Finally I hope you all have a relaxing and enjoyable run up to Christmas and the New Year.

Nature Notes

On a shallow lagoon at Keyhaven we saw a dabchick (little grebe) being quite a nuisance to a pair of mallard, repeatedly pushing into them while they dabbled for weed. The dabchick dived underwater every time a duck upended. It is thought that the dabchick was a young bird, now on its own and was using the ducks to perform the same function that its parents had.



A cluster of colourful widgeon drakes, with beautiful blue bills, was somewhat unruly, as young males often are, with their noisy and persistent whistling. A large flock of brent geese wheeled overhead and, as if in opposition, an even larger flock of Canada geese made their presence known in overhead flypass. By the end of October rooks had already returned to a nearby rookery where only one of last year's nests survives.

At a recent talk on garden birds we were advised to clean bird baths every day! Quite a tall order but feeders and bird baths are a focus for the virus that is responsible for the death of many greenfinches,; regular cleaning can really help.
