VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The presentations are now to be held on Friday 12th December 2014 at the Village Club. Sir George Young will be presenting the certificates to the worthy winners, who will be named in the next edition of the Tower. We would like to congratulate all those who were nominated and thank you all for the work you do for making Kingsclere a better community. There is also to be a presentation to our recently retired local Bobby, Brian Dixon, in thanks for all he did for Kingsclere.

HEAVY GOODS VEHICLE SURVEY RESULTS FOR KINGSCLERE

Hampshire County Council has recently presented the results of a comprehensive survey of Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGV's) to the Parish Council. The full summary and map of the area surveyed can be viewed on our website at www.kingsclere-pc.org. Briefly, all HGVs were counted coming in and through Kingsclere over two days in October 2013 and their movements logged. The results show that only one vehicle on each of the days actually travelled straight through the village without stopping, indicating that they had no business stops in the area. All other HGVs recorded had deliveries and pick-ups to make and were therefore registered as being here on business. The results have clearly shown that formal HGV restrictions would not be appropriate as the majority require access to the village for legitimate business reasons. With this information now available, further investigations into what may be possible in order to limit the impact of HGV traffic through the village will be undertaken.

DEAD FLOWERS IN KINGSCLERE CEMETERY

We will be organising a working party to tidy up the Cemetery in time for Christmas. During this clean-up we will be removing dead flowers from the graves so if anyone has any concerns in this regard, could they please contact the Parish Clerk on 01635 298634. Thank you.

ALLOTMENTS GROUP

The new Allotments Management Group, which has been formed to help advise us on the general maintenance and requirements of the gardens is now fully functional. They have helped us in updating our Rules and Regulations and are already suggesting many improvements to the benefit of all allotment tenants. We are currently looking into repairs to the perimeter fencing with the addition of an access gate to the newly acquired land to the north boundary. We look forward to working with them and thank all the volunteers who are helping in this way.

SPEED WATCH

Hopefully by the time this edition of the Tower arrives through your letterboxes, the Speed Watch Team will have all the equipment they need and be operating to help keep speeds down on certain roads in Kingsclere, making them safer for everyone. The Police have completed their vetting process of the volunteers and approved the roads we will be monitoring. Whilst we have enough volunteers to be able to start up, we would ideally like more people to offer their services. We would like to say a big thank you to all the volunteers and especially to Janet Bond for initiating this valuable service for Kingsclere.

The managers of The Crown arranged a working party and paid for all the plants that have completely transformed this once overgrown area. Thank you for the work you and your party have done.

On 26th October we had a successful day with a good group of us working on the bridleway at Frobury and the footpath behind the old chicken farm. Many thanks to Paul Oldring who agreed to let us use some of his brick rubble on the bridleway. As many of you will know this is a very wet path and we have worked on it for many years. Hopefully by using the brick rubble, improving the drain and clearing the ditch, we will have made some progress. A smaller group worked on the footpath where a lot of blackthorn suckers were threatening to take over the path and these have now been cleared. BUS UPDATE

following HCC Consultation Period on Bus Subsidised Services

At the October meeting of the Executive Member for Economy, Transport and Environment at HCC, despite my opposition to the proposed service reductions to Basingstoke Dial a Ride (BDaR), the decision was taken to re-tender and reduce funding. HCC are working towards a target date for the implementation of new contracts for BDaR and the Basingstoke Minibus Group Hire Scheme starting 1 June 2015.

Approval was granted for a draft Hampshire Concessionary Travel Scheme to be published in December 2014 for implementation from April 2015. This will see the start time for holders of older person's passes come in to line with the statutory scheme and move from a 9am start to <a href="mailto:9:30am. This will not affect holders of a disabled person's pass who will continue to be able to travel for free at all times.

BDBC Officers and I will be in dialogue with Stagecoach to see if they are able to offer a Senior Citizens reduction for pass holders that wish/need to travel prior to 9:30am.

Evening and Sunday services for Basingstoke town will be unaffected as borough funding already fully supports these services, protecting them from the HCC review.

I will update residents as and when I have further information.



Nature Notes

As we parked by the Canal at Kintbury we noticed a stack of what looked like very large sausages, only straw-coloured and possibly 2m in length. Further along the path to Hungerford we came across a team who were working in an area where the canal bank had collapsed and was threatening the towpath. They were lowering a 'sausage' into the water at the place where the bank had been and securing it with wooden stakes driven into the canal bed, the space behind was then filled with spoil. The tube was actually made of coir which had been pre-drilled and into which the same species of plants which occur naturally along the canal were to be introduced. The plants will root, the coir will rot and the bank will have been secured by natural means.

Himalayan balsam, Japanese knotweed and rhododendron are plants well known for their rampant and aggressive habits, presenting a threat to our native plants if not controlled. Little was known of these "thugs" when they were introduced as "must have" plants by the Victorians.

On a recent holiday to the Azores -a lovely archipelago of nine volcanic islands- we were shown three introduced and very invasive plants now established on all of the islands. A shrub, Pittosporum was originally used to provide shelter for the orange industry and hydrangea and ginger lily were valued for their flowers. The lily is astonishing in its "quatermass-like" spread but the hydrangea, although invasive, was found distasteful to cattle



and became useful as a hedging plant. Dairying supports the islands economy so this invader at least has a use.

Reflections



Peace at Christmas

Writing this shortly after Remembrance weekend with my mind still focused on the events of 100 years ago, thoughts of Christmas inevitably recall the Christmas truce which took place at various points on the Western Front on 24/25 December 1914.

Although the truce did not extend the whole length of the front (some soldiers write that fighting continued even on Christmas day in their stretch), there are nevertheless plenty of letters from men at the front providing first hand testimony that a truce did indeed take place in many places (although there is less certainty about the football match). For more detail see www.christmastruce.co.uk

The accounts of soldiers in opposing trenches (only yards apart) calling out to each other and then meeting in no man's land to exchange cigarettes and other small gifts, singing carols together are truly heart warming, and a reminder that war is primarily about international politics and not mutual hatred between individuals.

The Christmas truce shows that each side recognised the humanity of those against whom they were fighting and were able to allow that truth to trump other considerations for this short period. It reminds us too of the power that Christmas still has to bring out the best in people and to bring unlikely people together in recognition of something more important.

As we witness the continuing propensity of the human race to divide itself up along religious, sectarian and ethnic lines we need all the encouragement we can to find reason and ways to build bridges and put difference aside.

The Christmas story unites because it centres on something common to every human society – the wonder and the vulnerability of a newborn baby. In those days, nothing else could have provided common ground between shepherds and wise men. Christmas isn't easy these days with its materialist emphasis. But could we honour those who gave their lives by all making an effort to make peace with someone in our lives this Christmas time?

May you all know the peace of Christmas.


