Police Report

Kingsclere and Ashford Hill

There have been three reports of damage to vehicles. The first incident was at 2am on 1 June, to a van at Strokins Road. A similar report was also made at Elm Grove. On 8 June, a vehicle parked overnight at The Crown pub was damaged.



In other news, on 31 May, a TREK mountain bike was stolen from a garage at George Street. On 7 June, a CCTV camera was stolen from an address at St Mary's Road. On the same day, someone attempted to steal lead from an outbuilding at Foxes Lane, and several GIANT bikes were stolen from another address in the same street. On 19—20 June, a Honda quad bike was stolen from Baughurst Road.

Did you know? According to the charity Missing People, someone is reported missing every 90 seconds in the UK. The most common reasons include problems at home, abuse, mental health issues and dementia. Children and teenagers are more than twice as likely to go missing as adults. A vast majority of missing people are found within 24 hours, and over 96% are found within a week.

Fraud prevention advice There have been further reported incidents this month where persons have been cold-called by people pretending to be from the police. The person receiving the call is asked to attend the bank and withdraw cash, which is then handed over to a courier. This is a scam! Genuine police officers would not ask you to do this.

Nature Notes

On a recent trip to Catalonia we had an opportunity to cross into France to travel by barge on the Canal du Midi, an interesting trip especially down the lock ladder but very noticeable how the scenery must have been transformed recently. Ash die-back has seriously affected bankside trees leaving them bare and twiggy and as the trees are removed they are being replaced with a different species, possibly plane saplings. This results in a more open feel to the area.

While swallows, swifts and housemartin numbers are low in our own area, swifts and martins were truly abundant in N.E. Spain. Hordes of swifts flickered over the buildings and in one instance were using nest holes deliberately built into a hotel wall, the nestlings with their heads at the entrance of each ready to snatch a meal from the parent. In a hilltop fortress town we visited martins in hundreds found ideal conditions for nest building on the rough stone walls and beneath the projecting terra cotta tiles.

The HIOWWT has a new reserve and we went to see it recently. The site lies between the River Test on one side and the redundant Romsey canal. It is old farmland which was viable only by pumping out water but has, over time, reverted to natural bog and rough pasture. Skeleton trees stand in the centre having succumbed to the wet and the whole area has grown wonderfully wild with vegetation and flowers. Access paths have been laid and areas fenced off to allow British white cattle to graze. The old canal was full of colour along its length with brandy bottle lilies.

What a difference no school run makes to my life! No frantic mornings making sure everything is ready for the day ahead. No scrabbling around for swimming stuff or gym stuff. No

desperate rushing to try and make the back of the line as it moves into class! How the day begins differently when there is no deadline to get somewhere! And I bet the children are appreciating not being bossed around for 15 mins by two panicking parents, desperate not to be late! I suppose another approach might be just to be late but at the moment, we're trying not to do that, and to take bit of responsibility for them, which I guess is liberating for them even if they don't know it!

One of the great freedoms of being a Christian is that God is our Father and we are his children. Being children of God is something we've been thinking about quite a bit on Sunday mornings. One Bible verse that springs to mind is See what great love the Father has lavished on us that we should be called children of God! (1 John. 3:1). It reminds us of the abundance of God's love shown in Him inviting those who believe into His family. It means that God is no longer someone to hide from or cringe in fear before, worried whether He will approve of our lives or not, but He's a God we can run to like a child would their parent. The love we feel for our children is only a glimpse of the love that God has for His children. He, after all, sent Jesus to die for us so that all could have the opportunity to become His child.

We'd love to welcome you one Sunday morning at Kingsclere church and hope that when you come you might sense something of the presence of the God who lavishes His love on us. As I write that word 'lavishes', it feels a bit outrageous, even uncomfortable, but that's the God we have. Each Sunday, we meet at 8:45 for breakfast followed by the service beginning at 9:15. Services are also held at 8 or 11 on other Sundays – please see details in this magazine.

Changes to St Mary's Church Interior

Since last month's entry in the Tower the next set of plans have been prepared and are currently on display just inside the West Door of St Mary's.

We have included a drawing of the mezzanine floor arrangement in the Kingsmill Room to show how it will enhance the existing windows and make them visible on both floors using a 'trough' type arrangement. We have added light to the upper rooms by incorporating light from the Chancel area.

Much needed additional space will be created by the addition of this mezzanine floor which can be used by local groups and societies.

We have also included four different seating layouts to show how much more flexible the seating will be in the Nave of the church. This will allow for larger group meetings and concerts along with the flexibility of a large open space. Using individual seating, which can be easily stored, we will be able to adapt the area for many different uses.

The plans will remain on show and be updated as we make any changes.

Please don't forget that we have available an email address for you to make your ideas and suggestions known to the project team so that we can discuss and enhance our plan as we progress the project: Project.team@stmaryskingsclere.co.uk

Our plans are about to come under the watchful eye of the church authorities as we have a visit during late July to discuss what we are proposing.

The team will be on hand during the church fete on August 26th to discuss your thoughts and ideas.

A lot of comment has been made about 'how long will this take'? 'When will the work start'? How much will it all cost? Will the church have to close? We haven't got those answers yet but we will continue to seek the opinions of the people of Kingsclere to achieve a final plan. We are confident that as soon as our plan is complete, we can start the more intense process of preparing technical specifications to determine the cost of the project and start to plan its implementation.

Wow! We hope you enjoyed the D Day 75 convoy which came through the village 22nd of June, a once in a lifetime event for our great community.

The branch held a Waterloo Supper night in The Crown on

the 28th June, to remember the 8 Kingsclere men who fought and sadly were killed in action at the battle; the event well with more memorial suppers planned.

Those who walk through the churchyard will have seen the new Commonwealth War Grave headstone remembering Private Leonard Cramp; who was injured in France during World War 1 and underwent recuperation here in the village. We believe Leonard married a local lass and at some point died of his wounds. The work to have him remembered has been a long journey, but thanks must go to the Parish Council and St Mary's committee for their dogged determination to get this important work completed. A dedication service will be conducted before the launch of this year's Poppy Appeal in late October.

With agreement from the family, we plan to place a memorial stone in the Memorial Garden outside of The Crown for Jim Beasant, our last D Day Veteran who sadly passed away in January this year. Current plans see this event conducted on the last Saturday in August and we would welcome your support.

Plans for the 2019 act of Remembrance are underway and our new village Poppy Appeal Organiser, Mike Carrington, is busy with his preparations for the Poppy Appeal Launch. 1100 King William II (Rufus) killed by a crossbow bolt in mysterious circumstances while hunting in the New Forest, his ghost is still said to haunt the woods.

1346 With the help of the longbow the English army of Edward III defeats the French at the Battle of Crecy.

1740 '<u>Rule Britannia</u>' sung for the first time in public, in Thomas Arne's 'Masque Alfred'.

1765 King William IV born. William would go on to serve in the Royal Navy, earning him the nickname the "Sailor King".

1819 The *Peterloo Massacre* took place in Manchester at St. Peter's Fields.

1840 Britain bans the employment of climbing boys as chimney sweeps.

1875 Matthew Webb (Captain Webb) started his attempt from Dover in Kent, to become the first person to swim the English Channel. He reached Calais, France at 10.40 am the following morning, having been in the water for 22 hours.



1888 Birth of Thomas Edward Lawrence 'of Arabia'.

1896 Mrs. Bridget Driscoll of Croydon, Surrey, became the first pedestrian in Britain to die after being hit by a car.

1897 Birth of best-selling children's writer Enid Blyton, whose books have been among the world's best-sellers since the 1930s, with more than 600 million sold.

1900 Britain's first long distance bus service begins between London and Leeds. The journey time being 2 days!

1900 Coca Cola is sold for the first time in Britain.

1914 Britain declared war on Germany in support of Belgium and France, and on Turkey because of her alliance with Germany.

1926 Britain's first set of electric traffic lights appear on the streets of London.

1940 The first night of the Blitz as German planes bomb the city of London.




1940 Winston Churchill referring to the RAF pilots, says "Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few".
