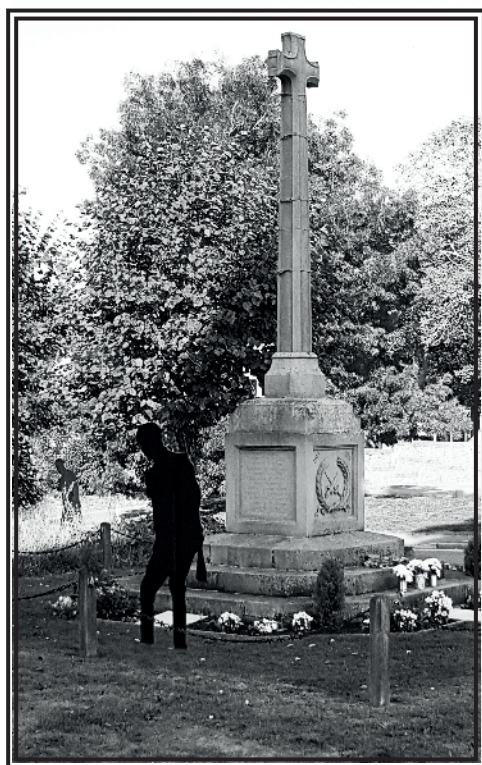

VILLAGE OF THE YEAR COMPETITION – The Parish Council entered Kingsclere into the Fullers Hampshire and Isle of Wight Village of the Year Competition for 2018. I am delighted to report that Kingsclere won the Excellence in Localism award and came runner up in the Best Small Village category. The awards reflect what a great place Kingsclere is to live in with lots of volunteers in the village doing lots of great things. This was the first time the current Parish Council had entered and has given us a feel for not only what we need to do to win but also where we can improve. The village was presented with a cheque for £100 and two certificates.

REMEMBRANCE BEACON - Like many towns and villages, Kingsclere will be lighting a Beacon at 7 pm on Sunday Nov 11th as part of the WW1 centenary commemorations. The beacon will be on the Canon Heath Down at the top of White Hill which overlooks Kingsclere. As there can be no public admittance to the site it can easily be viewed from the footpath to the right at the end of Fox’s Lane and especially along the Sydmonton road from Lord Huntingdon’s private road on the left where the gate will be open for cars to drive in and park.

Large areas of the land on Cannon Heath Down come under an agreement with Lord Huntingdon by Natural England and Harold Makant of that organisation has kindly given permission for the beacon to be on that site.

Nature Notes

A holiday on Alonissos, Greece brought us many sightings of hooded crows instead of our familiar carrion crows. The main difference is their pale grey body which contrasts with their black wings, tail and head (the hood). They could be described as crows with fashion sense as they certainly looked smart. It seemed strange to see them so far south as here we regard them as northern birds, N England, Scotland, Ireland and Scandinavia and a distribution map confirms this but also that they range eastwards across Russia, Adriatic, Greece and Turkey.



It was interesting to identify tiny highways in the sandy soil on the island as the work of black ants carrying peppercorn sized berries from lantana plants to their nests.

Some species of tree have started to shed their leaves but generally there is still a reluctance to let go of Summer and much of the countryside is still green-ish; a few sharp frosts will make a difference and we will then be into the glories of Autumn. An aspen tree in Love Lane is dropping both yellow and red leaves when yellow only seems usual.



It is good to know that local folk are caring for their visiting hedgehogs. Autumn is a critical time for these animals as they fatten up for hibernation. A large broken clay pot, lying on its side has made a feeding station for one regular visitor-arriving quite punctually after dark who polishes off a ration of homemade mixture. On one occasion two prickly shapes could be seen and heard, crammed side by side crunching away. European hedgehogs were also present on Alonissos.

Reflections



On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in the year 1918, the armistice between the Allied nations and Germany began. This agreement to cease hostilities was signed in a railway carriage in Compiègne, France at around quarter past five that morning. It brought peace to Europe, after the ravages of four long years of what was called the ‘Great War’. And that peace came at a great cost, particularly to those who fought, but also to those who remained at home.

As we think about that day this month, I’ve been thinking about what peace means for us who live in England today. It impacts everything, doesn’t it? Looking at places of conflict today, what we know is that lawlessness increases, education is disrupted, the economy struggles, food supplies are hit, and that’s not considering the loss to human life and devastation of the land and environment. That is pretty all encompassing, isn’t it? Peace is so precious and it means that we can live our lives as we do without worry about such things.

But the sad thing is that the peace of 1918 did not last; it was not ‘the war to end all wars’. We continue to see wars fought across our world, even if thankfully for us, not on our own soil. But a greater peace was won, a greater armistice was signed some nineteen hundred years or so before that. It was a peace that was won at great cost; it was an armistice signed in blood. It was a peace not between nations but between humanity and God, and it was a peace that would endure forever. It was a peace that dealt with the wrongs, with the aggressions, with the hostilities of mankind against God, and, remarkably, it was bought not through the promise of reparations from the guilty party, as in 1918, but through an offering of the ultimate reparation from the innocent party. God gave up His Son. Jesus willingly paid the ultimate price to bring the offer of peace to all.

And to know this peace, to experience this peace in our hearts, we must surrender, lay down our arms, sign our name on the armistice, and accept the sacrifice made on our behalf by Jesus Christ. Let’s put our faith in Him as we remember the end of the ‘Great War’.
