#### **VOLUNTEERS FOR TREE WARDEN ROLES AND THANK YOU -**

The village currently has two volunteer tree wardens who will be leaving their roles in the Autumn. We thank them for all they have done for the Parish and wish them well. We are now hoping that new volunteers will come forward and offer support for this scheme. The Tree Wardens scheme was set up by the Tree Council in association with local councils who appoint voluntary tree wardens to gather information, give advice, and encourage practical projects relating to trees in the community. No experience is necessary - just enthusiasm for trees and the local environment. Tree Warden tasks include being eyes and ears for the Parish Council on anything tree related, checking applications for work on trees with Tree Protection Orders (TPOs) or in conservation areas, doing surveys of trees and hedges, tree planting schemes and really anything else that the Tree Warden feels might be useful to the parish. If you would be interested in becoming a Tree Warden, please contact the Parish Council.

**HEDGES** – The Parish Council will be undertaking our autumn hedge cutting soon; we aren't permitted to perform hard cuts prior to September 1<sup>st</sup>. Please do cut back any hedges which overhang pavements and Rights of Ways which adjoin your properties.

**GREEN WHEELY BINS & GLASS RECYCLING** – The collection dates are Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> September and then 5<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

**NEXT PARISH COUNCIL MEETING** – The next full Council Meeting will be at 7:30 pm on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> September 2022, in the Village Club. # Kingsclere Neighbourhood Plan

The drop-in consultation for the proposed Porch Farm development was well attended, and a record number of residents have responded to the proposals along with the Parish Council. All responses and documentation relating to this proposed development are available to view on Basingstoke & Deane's planning portal: https://www.basingstoke.gov.uk/ planning. Enter the application number 22/01856/FUL.

The Neighbourhood Planning Group met again on 1<sup>st</sup> August. We are currently looking at possible potential sites in the event that we are given an additional housing allocation. We have been successful in obtaining free technical support from AECOM, the consultancy who produced the original Strategic Environmental Assessment for our NP.

B&D's Economic, Planning & Housing Committee are due to meet on 5<sup>th</sup> September where they will consider the Water Cycle Study and implications on future development. The Borough Council are hoping to publish the draft Local Plan review early in the autumn.

We will continue to keep residents updated on developments as they happen so, please keep checking the Parish Council web site and Facebook for further updates and the Local Plan review.

# Flu and Covid Vaccination Programmes

As information on the Flu and Covid programmes can change on a daily basis,



please wait for updates on our web site (**www.watershipdownhealth.com**), Facebook page and on our telephone message. Please don't call asking when they will be done as this takes up phone lines needed for patients who are unwell. It is likely that for eligible groups that the flu vaccination will be offered at the same time as the Autumn Covid booster at a central location, except for Housebound and Nursing Home patients. Please wait for our Team to contact you.

Please keep us informed (via our website, online messaging, by letter or by visiting reception) of any telephone/mobile telephone and email changes.

#### Who is the best clinician for me to speak to?

Whilst we are all used to speaking to our GP, it may at times be more appropriate to speak with another clinician within our Team. Our Receptionists are trained to try and match you with the most appropriate clinician. This may be the nursing team, the clinical pharmacists, social prescribers, mental health or the musculoskeletal team.

#### Appointment Reminders and Friends & Family Survey

We have a new system to send a reminder for all timed appointments. Feedback is that the new system is helpful, particularly for those with a smart phone. If you no longer need an appointment it can be cancelled from the reminder, which is sent out the day before an appointment.

Following an appointment, patients will receive a text asking them if they wish to complete a short Friends & Family survey. There are alternative ways to complete this survey; either with a paper version in all our waiting rooms or via our web site at:

# Reflections

Dear Friends,

As you read this, I will be settling back into the routine of ministerial life. During my time away, I spent nearly a month on the Isle of Mull. Much of the land there is used for open grazing and, time and again, my eye has been drawn to

the network of intersecting paths made by cattle and sheep visible on the hills. The sight invites reflection on the intersections that we encounter in our own lives.

At times our journey through life can seem completely mapped out and planned and we are clear as to the direction it will take, and with whom we shall be sharing it. At other times, it will seem that the journey we are on is simply a maze of intersecting paths with no specific destination or sense of companionship. Indeed, at times we can feel that we have been this way before and wonder how on earth we have managed to end up there again.

Our spiritual lives can be viewed in similar terms – sometimes we feel close to God and know with certainty that we are living as he asks us to. Sometimes we can wonder what this 'faith' business is all about and ask questions about God's presence and how we experience that in our daily lives. These questioning times often occur when the 'routine' of life has been disturbed by an unexpected encounter with news that has challenged the status quo. The solid things of life are removed or compromised and we can feel abandoned to run with the sheep along unfamiliar paths without any sense of purpose.

In these circumstances I have found two Old Testament passages to be reassuring and to provide a focus which will, in due course, bring me back to the providence of God:

"But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour." Isaiah 43:1-3

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." Jeremiah 29:11

So for those who view the new school/college/church year with some anxiety or for those for whom the next few months will be an unanticipated journey, may these words provide some encouragement that God is in charge of our "going out and our coming in from this time forth and for evermore" (Psalm 121:8).

In late July we walked the path of the River Alre in New Alresford, a favourite of ours and part of a much longer circuit that we used to make. To those not familiar with the area, the river is short at less than 4 miles long and yet for much of its length it is a typical Hampshire trout river, and empties into the Test. The public path leads to an ancient eel house, now refurbished (but not for use) and some of the bank has been broadened into the river to increase the flow. There is a popular part where children (and adults) like to pepper the water-life with pelleted food obtainable from a charity dispenser for a small sum. Among the flurry of ducks was a pair of swans with eight fully grown cygnets. Diana knelt at the bankside at swan eye level to feed the youngsters from cupped hand; they were boisterous feeders but perfectly behaved. Further along the path there is a plaque in memory of HAMBONE, the mascot of 109 Division US Army, to which someone has recently added a tiny gravel garden and planted a small American flag; a nice gesture.

One three occasions in early August ravens have been seen over the village, their presence being heralded by the call that only the raven makes. Widespread as they are built up areas may be less attractive than open country thus not so common here. Carrion is their standard diet but a quote from Birds Britannica states that they will eat anything from a worm to a whale. While vegetable matter is acceptable, ravens can kill live prey such as rabbits, rats, hedgehogs and moles as well as a range of birds. The largest of the crow family, their broad, wedge-shaped tail and a habit of closing their wings and diving momentarily identifies them in flight.

#### The Community Larder - Summer 2022 Update

What started as a temporary idea at the beginning of lockdown in March 2020 has grown into a valuable service to many in our local community. The Community Larder is now open each week and serves approximately 30 local families who are in need. We are finding that as costs of energy and food increase, so the need for help increases too. Our aim is to help those struggling to make ends meet with basic food and hygiene item, as well as distributing supermarket discontinued or "short dated" fresh bread, fruit and vegetables that would otherwise be thrown away.

#### How can I help?

A group of volunteers run the larder – from sorting incoming donations and stocking the shelves to serving customers, making tea &coffee and clearing away at the end. We are always keen to invite more volunteers to come and be on the rota. There are two shifts 11 am -12.30 pm and then 2.15 - 4.15 pm, but we need 7 or 8 people each Thursday to make everything run smoothly. If you are able to help us even just occasionally then please do get in touch.

The other thing that the larder relies on is donations. We are really grateful to those who regularly donate items of food. They can be dropped off Thursday mornings 11.30 am - 12.30 pm to the Kingsmill Room, or left during the Saturday coffee morning 10 - 12 am also in the Kingsmill Room (there is a marked box available at the back of the room). A weekly list of our most needed items is available by email or on paper (pick up in the Kingsmill Room on Thursdays), but we welcome any items of tinned/dried or packet food and hygiene and laundry products.

We appreciate that some people cannot get to the Kingsmill Room at those times to drop off items, so we have set up two other ways to donate:

Amazon wish list. This enables you to buy items that we need through Amazon, and they are then delivered straight to us. They can be anonymous, or you can include details of who sent them. Please visit www.amazon.co.uk/hz/wishlist/ls/2G6XREPO8DF6E?ref =wl share

We have our own bank account, and several people already generously give financially to the Community Larder. We then use this money to buy additional food to top up our stocks of food. If you would like to donate in this way, please contact us.

#### How can I use the larder as a client?

Just come along! Every Thursday in the Kingsmill Room 2.30 - 4 pm (please note earlier closing time from  $1^{st}$  September).

From 1<sup>st</sup> September we are changing the way in which the larder operates due to the increasing need we are seeing. We want to make sure the stock

that we have is shared among those who need it, regardless of what time you are able to get to the larder. We will be arranging the room so that when you arrive you will be offered a tea/coffee and can help yourself to one bag full of fresh fruit/vegetables/bakery items. You will then be served by volunteers who will pick from the shelves for you a bag of tinned/dried/household/ hygiene items. The cost for this is just £3.

The larder is not means-tested. There are no vouchers and no questions will be asked. We are open to all who feel that they need help with basic food items to be able to feed themselves and their families.
