

Library Closure

Many people will by now have heard of plans to close the Library,

Kingsclere has had a library since 1880, when the Coffee and Reading Rooms were opened in what is now the Village Club in George St. It seems a shame that we should lose it after over 130 years. Sadly the decision to close it, as yet another financial saving, appears to be final and the current consultation is whether the village would wish to continue with retaining the present facility manned by volunteers or replace if with a library van provided that a location can be found where it can stand for half a day a week.

I am aware that a lot of people have come forward to help run a community library but I think we should all be aware of the key issues. The head of library services has already said that HCC will support a community library with books, etc. and with logistical services so the county will still incur some costs after the closure but the key costs will be the rental for the facilities and the day-to-day running costs. The current cost of running the branch library is in the region of £23k a year.

Two libraries which closed after the last round of cuts have reopened as community libraries and appear to be going well but it is important to realise the implications of doing so in Kingsclere. The Village Club currently receives £2000 a year income from renting the library facilities. We can ill-afford to lose this income stream and it would have a considerable impact on our financial viability. If this is not forthcoming from the library then we, the Managing Trustees, may have to seek an alternative user who can pay the rent. It will be necessary for any community group to raise, not only the rent but also the other running costs of the library such as electricity and cleaning.

Reflections



Que sera, sera

Will the terrible weather which has been disabling parts of Britain for the last two months have stopped by the time you are reading this? Even if it has, many will still be living with it's devastating after effects. With so much evident distress, the most unedifying part of it all has been the politicians bickering and all kinds of people playing the blame game.

By now, however, many are of the view that any amount of dredging is unlikely to have changed things drastically. The clue lies in the words 'natural disaster'. Whatever our ingenuity and whatever our budgets, the forces of nature are still beyond human control.

How we hate this, we who fancy ourselves so sophisticated that we don't need God any more, faith being a refuge only for the deluded. Yet belief in God which goes alongside an acknowledgement of human limits actually seems to make people more resilient. Being more accepting and less angry at such events makes people more able to pick themselves up and move on as seems to have been the case in e.g. Haiti and the Philippines.

Thoughtful Christianity believes in human free will and the obligation on humans to make very best use of skills and talents to work in the service of others. Nevertheless it also accepts that there are limits to our human capabilities. The term Act of God which will soon be called upon in countless insurance claims doesn't imply that God has wilfully organised this terrible weather but it does imply a limit to where human culpability lies. It is to be hoped that those in positions of power and influence will direct their energies towards helping the worst affected to rebuild their lives and to adopting long term policies to reduce the impact of such events in the future.





Nature Notes

We have often walked alongside local streams and noted how high their banks were in relation to the water that they carried whilst at the same time showing evidence of flood debris amongst bank side bushes. Could these modest streams really rise six feet or so above their normal level? We donned our wellies and set out to see. The fields at Ashford Hill were under water but the footpaths were negotiable and we arrived at the copse where a stream ran through except, no stream, just a huge expanse of flooded trees and meadow and beyond this, the Enborne, which had also merged into the surrounding flood and where only the top part of the wooden bridge was visible. At this point we stopped, curiosity satisfied but aware of the danger to anyone who did not know the area and who decided to wander off the path and find themselves, not in inches of water but out of their depth.

Being accustomed to the robust bunchy ivy so commonly seen we discovered a quite different plant in The Chase at Woolton Hill. This was a most delicate, tiny leaved specimen, daintily climbing in the bark fissures of a few trees. One might consider that its compact form would be of commercial interest.

In direct contrast were the tall remnants of a very large horsetail growing by a stream elsewhere. Almost indestructible, horsetails are prehistoric in origin with a range of species growing from 30cm. to 2 metres. Researching this plant led us to the fact that horsetails predate wirewool as a pan scrubber due to the silica crystals they contain.



Kingsclere Library

Proposals for the future of Kingsclere Library:

library is one of three classed as "under-used" in Hampshire.

Hampshire County Council has had to make further budget savings of 12% by April 2015. Councillor Keith Chapman, Hampshire's executive member for culture & recreation and county councillor for Calleva and Kingsclere speaking at the parish council meeting spoke of the difficult decisions he has to make because of the budget cuts and told councillors that the library, which costs the council £23,500 per annum to run, including staffing costs, only attracts 650 visitors a month with 190 borrowing. The

The Library Service is keen to enter into discussions with groups or organisations who might be interested in taking over full responsibility for the running of Kingsclere library on a voluntary basis. The library service would provide initial training for the volunteers. The community group would be responsible for the associated costs.

If there is no interest from the community in running the library then from January 2015 the library service to Kingsclere will be provided through a mobile library, visiting the village for half a day each week. This is dependent on a suitable location being found for the mobile library stop.

A formal 90-day consultation on the future of the library began in February and ends on Friday, 2nd May 2014.
